My name is Joseph Young. I am a lifelong Lutheran, born into a family of 6 (and the only boy!) from north eastern Illinois. I graduated from college back in 2012 and have worked in various industries (non-profit, government agencies, universities). After completing my undergraduate work, I had the privilege and chance to serve as a Young Adult in Global Mission (YAGM) in Mexico. Through this experience, in conjunction with what my experience had been in the United States, I started to see the world (and my life) in a much different way. As a bi-racial man who is seen/perceived in many ways I can tell you that life has been both very challenging and very rewarding.

I presently serve as an Admissions Counselor as a part of the University of Wisconsin System in southeastern Wisconsin. Through that work, I serve communities of color in directly helping provide education, information, resources, and a myriad of other services for students thinking about college. My ultimate goals in life are to build bridges, build relationships, provide aid where I can, and learn from others as much as I can. I've often chosen to challenge myself in new ways, and in sharing my experiences I hope to continue to do what I feel God has called me to.

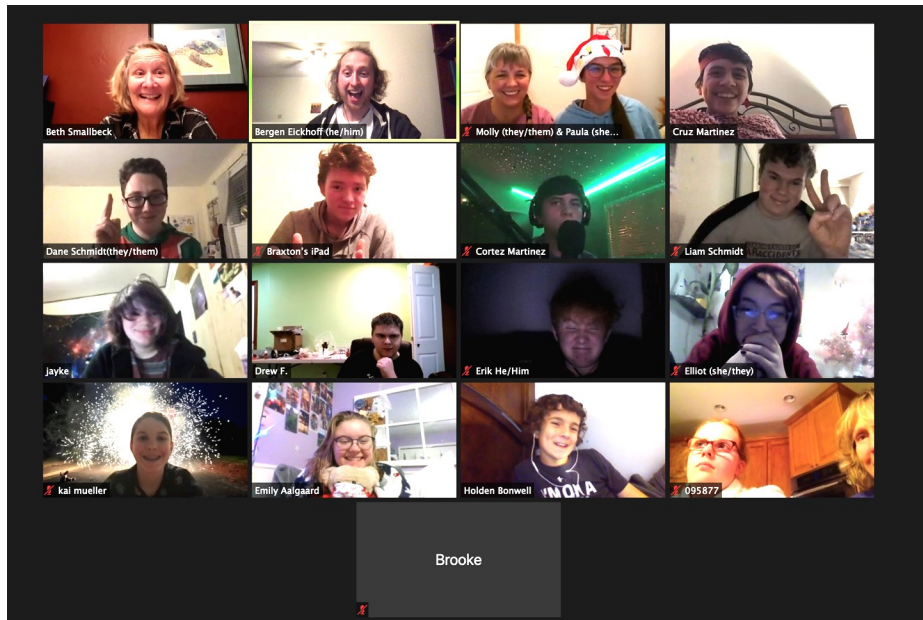

Emery Thomas Rohde

JULY 26, 1927 – DECEMBER 10, 2020

Rev. Emery Rohde was pastor at Grace Lutheran from 1957 - 1962. During his time as pastor the building fund was established and our current building was completed.



Emery entered into eternal life on Thursday, December 10, 2020. He was 93 and lived a long, fulfilling life. Born in Detroit on July 26, 1927, Emery grew up a sports fan of the Lions, Tigers, Red Wings and Michigan football. As a Wolverine fan he had a deep dislike for the Ohio State

Buckeyes. Despite his dislike for Ohio State, Emery went to college and seminary at Capital University in Columbus, Ohio, graduating with his Masters of Divinity in 1953. While on

seminary internship in Oregon City he met Elaine Knoefel and they were married on June 28, 1953. Emery and Elaine were married for just over 50 years. After Elaine's death in 2004, Emery married Ruth Kretzinger and they were together for 12 years before her death in 2018. Emery served many congregations during his many years in ministry. His first congregation was Christ Lutheran in Vancouver, BC; Grace Lutheran, Wenatchee; Phinney Ridge Lutheran in Seattle; Our Saviour's Lutheran in Arlington. Emery retired from full-time ministry in 1991. However, he never fully retired from being a pastor, Emery served as interim pastor at Our Saviour's Lutheran in Sunnyside, Christ Lutheran in Yakima and visitation pastor at Central Lutheran in Yakima for 7 years. Emery and Elaine had 3 children, son Gary and wife Suzie; son Tom and wife Jody and daughter Lisa and husband Doug. Emery had 4 granddaughters and 4 great grandchildren. Emery moved back to Arlington his last couple of years and lived at Olympic Place. He enjoyed playing BINGO, socializing at Happy Hour, leading Sunday worship and mid-week Bible Study. He appreciated the staff for all they did and actually liked the food. Memorial services are being planned for a later date when we can gather safely. Five Moments of Spirituality from 2020

I love End-of-the-Year lists. I love reading through a publications evaluation of the best music, books, movies, or moments from the past year. And while it is impossible to think back upon this year without remembering heartbreaking losses, this year has also been a year of great spiritual growth for me, where I've felt God's presence working in my life. So I would like to share five of my most significant moments of witnessing the Holy Spirit's work in the world with you all.

1. The First Days of the Pandemic — In one week, I went from being a normal seminary student to taking online classes while living in my parents' basement with my then-partner (now wife), Clara. Our lives had been upended by the pandemic, and I gained perspective on how little control we really have in this world, and how much we rely upon the support and love of people in our lives. I experienced God's love through friends and family members, but I also came to recognize God calling me to recognize how society does not offer many people, especially people of color, safety nets like it does to me. We need to change that as we emerge from this pandemic

2. Delivering Supplies during the Twin Cities Protests — Protests erupted in the Twin Cities in response to George Floyd's murder by police officers, and in the chaos of the governments' response many people were thrown into food insecurity. Wishing to help, Clara and I gathered supplies from suburban grocery stores and drove them to a Lutheran church in downtown Minneapolis. This church had transformed their building to serve as a center for medical care, food distribution and collection, and spiritual care for a whole community. Witnessing this transformation reignited my faith for how the Church can serve the needs of our neighbors and be Christ's hands and feet in the world.

3. Getting Married! — Clara and I got married with just fifteen people in direct attendance, but we were floored when over three-hundred people attended our service online! Though our wedding was different than we expected, the care and support of so many family and friends showed me that marriage is the request of two hearts for God to bind them together so that they may be a constant reminder of God's love to one another and all around them for the rest of their lives. Love is a life-giving force, and that's become apparent to me this year more than any other.

4. Experiencing Welcome in Wenatchee — I was terrified to begin my pastoral internship during a pandemic, but after the first three weeks I realized that I had nothing to fear. This congregation provided Clara and I with such an affirming welcome, whether from the numerous invitations to socially-distanced meetings, the drive-through greeting at the intern house, the moving of a new piano into the intern house, or even just running into people on the Loop Trail who recognized me from the online worships. I felt immediately accepted and welcomed by the hospitality of a church who knows that they are created and called by God to live out the love of Jesus Christ.

5. Participating in a Home Baptism — On the day after Christmas, Pastor James and I performed a baptism for Clementine Lease on the patio outside of Tiny Skagen's house. Selfish as it may sound, I was terrified to be around people. Yet during the service I was overcome with the assurance that we are claimed as God's children and saved by the sacrifice of Jesus Christ in both our life and in our death. No matter what the world looks like we are called to love and serve our neighbors and our world. The enduring promise and call of God has not changed, we are simply called to believe in it with greater hope than ever before.

Those are my musings on some of my most significant moments of spirituality from this past year! I would encourage you to find comfort and inspiration by reflecting on how God has been active in your life in the past year as well. And know that I will always be willing to hear about your own moments of encountering the Holy Spirit whenever you would like to share. The more we share about the Spirit, the more we'll be reminded of God's love for us and this whole world. And that can only be a good thing.
