Thoughts About Culture (and Kinship)

"Go... teach them to obey my commandments." (from Matthew 28)

"I have become all things to all people, so I might by all means save some." (from 1 Corinthians 9)

Dear friends in Christ,

Years ago, I was very surprised to learn that culture and cultural differences should be recognized and studied in large AND small ways. I was somewhat aware of the larger ways to understand culture: American culture as compared to other countries, Christian culture compared to other religions, cultures of various languages and ethnicities. I could operate well, I thought, with a standard set of assumptions and definitions. Also, in all honesty, I thought that I could avoid discomfort by populating my relationship circles with people I thought were most like me.

Then, the lid blew off of my understanding when I realized the often-overlooked influence of "smaller" cultural difference. There is a culture in one's workplace. There is family culture. In religion, there is cultural difference not only between faiths, but also between faith communities (the cultures of Celebration Lutheran Church in East Wenatchee and Grace Lutheran are different). The complexities of culture related especially to one's values, lived experience, and personal histories gave me the feeling that I was standing at the base of a very high mountain, and was expected to climb. (Where I grew up, mountains existed in photos only.) I didn't feel like I could be a cultural tourist anymore. To use another metaphor, I got a sense that I was all of a sudden in a mine field, not wanting to make mistakes, not wanting to offend, not wanting to be so curious about the difference of the other that my attention made the other feel like a cultural specimen. Philosophically, I wondered how in God's name could communication and common understanding between people even happen!

The above scripture quotes lift up two possible missteps about culture, on entering the culture of another. Followers of Jesus are people who are sent. There is something worth sharing with the world, and my hope is that you get a reminder every time you engage with this congregation. One misinterpretation of the Matthew verse, often called the Great Commission, assumes that the culture of the other needs to be corrected, or even superseded by the culture of the missionary. "Teaching them to obey" must mean demanding that the other culture must divorce themselves from their own treasured past and be ever-so grateful that the Gospel (in particular the gospel-bearers) came into their lives. Now, they can "get it right." Can you see the problem with this? Cultural dominance creates a lot of collateral damage. Cultural communities are forced into a position where they grieve the loss of so much good in what came before. This approach creates a kind of spiritual cultural classism that isn't easily shaken. This is a topic of great exploration and study and has led to a radical rethinking of mission movements. When Jesus prayed "I came that they might have life, and have it abundantly", I am certain he was not calling for cultural erasure.

To proclaim and celebrate the gospel of Jesus Christ through word and sacraments so that a community of believers is created, trained, nurtured, and sent into mission.

Next, a verse from the Apostle Paul: "I have become all things to all people." What an awesome thing to aspire to: the idea that I could be so like, so similar to the other that there are absolutely no barriers to their understanding of the gospel message. This verse seems to speak of the possibility that I can so deeply and thoroughly understand another person that they can't even detect any difference between themselves, and me. We could be fused with one another as a means to further the gospel. Well, I hope you can see this is impossible. The damage caused by taking this idea to its logical conclusion is that I (as the one sent) become nothing, a kind of blank page or a piece of foil that gets pressed onto the totality of the other. I don't think the other is really looking for copies of themselves. Is there another way to "be"?

The word "kinship" comes to mind. I see that to mean, "I am me. You are you." Kinship does not repel you from me, or me from you. Kinship creates space for exploring and marveling over one another's difference. When both choose to resist not the culture of the other, but rather the impulse to overpower the other, there can be a gentle, tender new growth that can be nurtured over time. It's tough work, and I have not arrived. I can tell when it works, and I'm slowly getting better at noticing when it doesn't.



SOCIAL CONCERNS TEAM

Members in Need Fund:



With current events regarding COVID-19, we acknowledge that some of our members will experience financial difficulties. There is a confidential process for financial help for our members and people who are involved in our faith community. The Members in Need Fund can help a household with up to \$300 per calendar year to help meet expenses. Forms are available on the resource tab of glowen.org. The form can be printed, filled out, and mailed to the church. You can also email a copy to pastor@glowen.org.

Applications are reviewed by a small committee consisting of the Pastor, Council President, and team leader of the Social Concerns Team.

Food Drive Challenge:

As many of you know, the Social Concerns Team along with several members of our congregation started a food drive the first of June and will continue to September 13th, 2020 (GOD's Work. Our Hands Day). The purpose of the food drive is to help support Wenatchee Valley Area Food Banks. The Social Concerns Team has committed up to \$10,000 to match what monies can be raised by the church. If the church can raise \$10,000, that means \$20,000 or more will be raised for the Wenatchee Valley Area Food Banks. As of June 23rd, the congregation has distributed 24 Thrivent Action Team Cards. An additional seven cards have been approved and are in the mail and \$750 in cash has been collected. In total the congregation has raised \$8,500. We are very close to our goal of \$10,000. With the Social Concerns Team match we have \$18,500, just \$1,500 short of our goal of \$20,000.



Currently the Food Banks are in need of food items (except onions & potatoes). The monies from the Federal Government will not kick in for a while, and with the COVID 19 crisis the need is great. The following are some food banks that are being supported by this drive:

How you can be a part of the food drive:

For current Thrivent Members, Thrivent Action Team Cards make it easy to live generously. It starts with a simple question: "Who can I help and how?" In this particular case, you can help the Wenatchee Valley Area Food Banks by logging into your account and filling out the online application for the \$250 Action Team Card to support this event.

For Non-Thrivent Members there are two options:

- 2. If you choose to donate monetarily, you can make your check out to Grace Lutheran Church with a notation of Wenatchee Valley Area Food Banks, and mail your check to the church.

GOD'S Work Our Hands:

GOD's Work Our Hands Day will take place on September 13th, 2020. This year's projects are Packing Friendship and The Wenatchee High School Panther House. More information will be available in upcoming newsletters.

ELCA NWIM Synod:

The Social Concerns Team has been awarded a \$2,000 COVID 19 block grant from the ELCA-NWIM Synod for the GLC Packing Friendship program. The monies will be spent to stock shelves for GLC Packing Friendship this coming school year.



Families in Need Update:



The Social Concerns Team has been working with the Wenatchee Valley Follies Guild to help a family we are calling "Family L". The team has helped "Family L" to obtain legal assistance and to contact the appropriate individuals at DSHS. They also provide financial assistance and financial guidance when appropriate, and have worked with the county and city to repair their lot from the flood damage of August 2019. They continue to help the adults obtain their GEDs.

With the monies received from the COVID19 Block Grant from the NWIM Synod, the team is taking on an additional family. "Family P" consists of a mother, grandmother, a 13-year-old son, a high school age daughter and an older son who graduated from high school last year. The mother and high school age daughter are working in a warehouse. The older son, who graduated from high school a year ago has a baby at home who he takes care of. The grandmother takes care of the 13-year old son. The father is no longer living, so the only source of income is the mother and high school aged daughter. Members of the Social Concerns Team will be meeting with "Family P" to assess the best way to help this family.

Just a reminder-Cash position was reduced by \$40,000 at yearend and Special Projects fund established, thus the large variance in cash available between 2019 and 2020.

As we continue on with COVID restrictions...Comparing January through May 2019 and January through May 2020, total offerings are down \$40,626. Expense comparison reflects reduction of \$16,681 for the same time period. Overall the 2020 year-to-date deficit is (\$28,358). This compares to budget estimate of (\$12,591).

FOX TRUST UPDATE. The value of the monies transferred in March was \$2,375,875. We then transferred \$1,000,000 to certificate of deposit with ELCA Mission investment fund, distributed \$100,000 in tithing, with remainder to brokerage account \$1,275,587. Balance of brokerage account as of 5/31/20 is \$1,435,904. The sale of the East Wenatchee property is scheduled to close July, 2020.
