Pastor's Message

Dear friends,

We are heading back inside! The sanctuary will be ready for us to worship together with one another starting 9:00 am, July 11. I have feelings of relief and gratitude along with lingering frustrations. I do not think I am alone in that.

When I was a kid, Dr. Doolittle was a big deal. The most captivating animal to me was the "push-me-pull-you." Here is a photo in which you can see very human-looking calves representing the animal's legs. My childhood observations were two-fold: moving "forward" is a matter of perspective only; and how does it poop?



Moving forward. Taking steps as a congregation to have more ministry in person has little risk, some risk, or great risk, depending on who you ask. Do the decisions made by some in your community give you the feeling you are walking backward? Pushing and pulling are part of the character of congregational life, and communal life in general. There are only a few options in leadership and the middle ground often feels like a very narrow space. Do you ever feel that decisions are like the experience of this strange creature?

There are several in our congregation who represent the medical field, some expressing more caution and some a bit less, but as a group they want to see measures taken that ultimately lower the risk of infection to everyone who takes part in our ministries. Not to boast, but the Christian movement has been the impetus for many advances in medical knowledge for the sake of protecting the neighbor and promoting wellness and healing. Medicine and science have deep roots in Christianity. Promoting the wellness of the greater community is a Christian principle.

Also, lately I have found myself thinking about another part of our history, that Christian communities were known to be the ones tending the very sick during pandemics when they knew it was very risky to do so. In other words, they gave their very lives over to serve the neighbor. The direction we took in our context was to suspend inside, in-person worship as a way of loving and serving the whole community. It was a collective action that I hope we can remember as an example of sacrificial service. This is not the same as sitting alongside someone dying of COVID, but it was one measure we can say reflected knowledge and appreciation for data as well as giving something up for the sake of the greater whole.

What can the Spirit do with the push-me-pull-you? Here is my deepest prayer, that the Spirit of the Crucified and Risen One will help us move past, or away from any polarizing image like that strange animal and grant us a new vision. To give something up for the well-being of the neighbor will continue to be a theme for us. There has been frustration and exasperation, with some pulling away from our congregation which does not sit well for me as pastor. There have been others who applaud our caution, which certainly does not cancel out the complaints of others. It does reveal that there are many ways to think about and act on our participation with one another's lives as a faith community, and the congregation will always be shifting and changing like the living organism it is, and in the midst of it all we still proclaim to one another that we each belong both to Christ and to one another.

In stark contrast, it took all of five seconds to find a tidal wave of misleading, sensational, negative content about these amazing young people.

Something had to be done. Jen joined forces with friend and mentor Gearah Goldstein, an expert on diversity and inclusion, wife, parent, and proud transgender person. Together, with five extraordinary young people and their families, GenderCool was born.

Today, GenderCool has become a worldwide movement.

Lutheran World Relief – Border Crisis

At the June 1st Social Concerns meeting, committee members decided to sponsor a special money drive at GLC during the months of July and August to help ELCA AMMPRO with their work with immigrants at the U.S.-Mexico border.

Working with Lutheran Social Services, this group is focusing on establishing family foster care sponsors for the many children left alone at our borders. They are also volunteering at the shelters, right now at the San Diego Convention Center. Families crossing the border are also being helped by sponsoring Lutheran congregations.

Smoke Removal Fans



Grace Lutheran Church has been asked to be a part of the solution of wildfire smoke removal from homes by providing box fans with a filter system. These fans are needed to pull smoke out of a home without HVAC, when there are fires/smoke. The most vulnerable population is our migrant workers as well as our immigrant population. They are often overlooked or cannot afford such things.

What does that look like for us?

First, the Social Concerns Team will be contributing \$1,050 toward the purchase of twenty-five fans. The cost of one fan/filter set is \$42.00. The Social Concerns Team is working with First United

Methodist Church who is also contributing monies and time to the project.

Second, we need to have a building party to put these fan kits together. If you are interested in being part of the building party, you can contact Bob Bartlett at bobbartlett1@outlook.com or Mike Sweeney at Sweenee@gmail.com.

Benevolence Highlight - Chelan Douglas Community Action Council - Mobile Food Pantry

With funding from the North Central Accountable Community of Health, the Chelan Douglas Community Action Council launched a Mobile Food Pantry in December 2020. The Pantry was designed and built by Tiny House Cribs of Wenatchee and resembles a tiny home, a welcoming design to help people feel comfortable. Once inside the Mobile Food Pantry, customers will find a variety of fresh, dried, canned, and frozen food items. The selection includes fresh fruit and vegetables, milk, eggs, cheese, pasta, rice, canned soup/meat/



vegetables, and frozen items like ground beef, chicken, fish, and pork loin. Less frequent or limited supplies of flutts, flour, cooking oil, paper products and personal hygiene products are offered. All items are free of charge and limited personal information is collected. Basic information on customers includes name, address, and household size.

The Mobile Food Pantry was designed to be operated by AmeriCorps members who serve for 10.5 months, September to mid-July. Our current AmeriCorps members have worked to understand layout and weight distribution requirements inside the Pantry, established relationships and locations to distribute food, gathered customer feedback and shared challenges and opportunities. The Mobile Pantry is scheduled to be serving six times in the month of June, including locations in East Wenatchee, Cashmere, Bridgeport, and Manson.

Why I Am Bisexual

Hello Grace Lutheran Church! With the passing of the Reconciling in Christ Statement, and in celebration of Pride month, I would like to let you all know that I am bisexual.

This was not something that I was keeping from you. I only managed to come out a few months before the internship began, and I didn't want my sexuality to interfere with the Reconciling in Christ process. But now that it is passed, I am glad and proud to come out to you all!

I can imagine that you might have some questions, but I'll do my best

First, my bisexuality is an essential part of how I experience life, relationships, love, self-worth, purpose, and connection. While the prefix "bi" might imply that I am only attracted to men or women, but bisexual people can be attracted to people of many different genders, and I have been attracted to men, women, non-binary, and gender expansive people throughout my life!

But wait, am I not married to a woman? Yes! Happily so. I intend to be married to Clara for the rest of my life! But that doesn't mean that I still don't experience attraction, and it doesn't erase all of the attraction I've experienced prior to becoming married. Plus, my bisexuality influences how I am so fully in love with Clara. So I have always been, and will always be, bisexual!

And my bisexuality affects so much more than romantic relationships. I think that music critic Sasha Geffen puts it best when they explain how heterosexual attraction is usually built upon difference, whereas queer attraction is built upon affinity and similarity. I grew to form friendships because of the intense similarities I saw between myself and I crave friendships and community that feel like a part of myself. I have always been at my best when in communities or friendships built upon intense trust, inclusivity, mutuality, defiance of norms and limitations, and a shared passion for life.

Because of this, my bisexuality is a significant part of my faith in God and my vocation to ministry! I have always loved Lutheranism for its call to receive salvation through the grace of Jesus Christ and live out God's love through our authentic selves in a close, compassionate, and uplifting community. My identity as bisexual guided me to appreciate the beauty of both/and connections rather than either/or separations: God loves us because we are both saints and sinners, Jesus saves us so that we are both fully free and fully called to a life of service. As a result, my identities as bisexual and Christian intertwine to direct me towards a vision of church that proclaims all to be welcome and commits itself to the mission of total inclusivity and celebration for everyone's unique gifts and faith. I believe that my bisexuality is a blessing from God for it has expanded my capacity to love and be loved in every possible way.

So why do I feel the need to let everyone know? Well, most people probably assumed that I was heterosexual until I mentioned otherwise. That's not an accusation! That's merely what we've been conditioned to do! So if you already believed that you knew my sexuality, it's only fair that I clarify the matter by letting you know that I am bisexual.

But a good portion of the world does not believe that bisexual people exist, and some believe that LGBTQ+ people do not have the right to exist. I've dealt with anxiety and feelings of intense unworthiness because of the prejudice against LGBTQIA+ people, and I'm not alone. I was only able to come out after years of fear because of the unconditional love of Clara, the compassion of family and friends, and the support of mentors and communities. You all at Grace have helped me become more confident in living boldly as who I am, and you all deserve to know that your choice to accept someone for who they are is nothing short of life-changing and world-changing.

I feel the need to let people know because my bisexuality is a crucial part of why I believe in Jesus Christ. Remember that I developed to seek affinity with people of all kinds and naturally seek both/and relationships rather than either/or separations, it is only in the Gospel of Jesus Christ that I find a God who connects all creation in both/and relationships and who loves all people with a deep intimacy that transforms their lives from sorrow to celebration. To keep my bisexuality from you would be like trying to preach the Bible without knowing what words mean. It's an essential framework for my interpretation of God's scriptures, my experience of Christ's love, and my perceived place in the Spirit's mission.

So I am bisexual, because that is who God made me to be and who Jesus saved me to be! And I hope that my witness as a bisexual intern pastor assures and reassures you that God loves every part of who you are so much that it seems ridiculous; that Jesus has both freed you from your sins *and* liberated to live as your full self; that the Spirit celebrates who you are and is transforming you into who you become. I am beyond grateful to be the Intern Pastor at Grace Lutheran Church. I am proud to be your intern pastor. I hope that being open about my sexuality leads us to a deeper relationship of trust. I hope that what I've written inspires you to bring the love of this church community out into the world around us, so that all the kids, adults, and families of Wenatchee and beyond know that they are loved because of what makes them unique and that their unique way of loving is beautiful. And I hope to learn about what makes you unique, dear person of Grace, and how your unique experience has led you to express the love of Jesus Christ in your life.






Farewell Intern Bergen and Clara!
