Some thoughts for June and July

It's early morning, I'm walking my dog in commons area near our home. There are two small ponds with cattails growing back. It's pretty much quiet, other than redwing blackbirds singing their distinctive song, a pair of kildeer trying to lure us away from their nest, Eurasian doves cooing and an occasional frog croaking. It is wonderful to sense the harmonies which can be seen and heard in early hours. It's the same kind of thing I saw and heard in both North and South Dakota.

I stood there remembering an early morning when I was sneaking into my turkey hunting spot in the early morning darkness on the North Dakota prairies. It was absolutely calm and quiet except for the sound of my footsteps on the dry leaves. Upon finding my spot I sat and took in the silence. But then the sun started to peek over the horizon and nature started waking up. What a cacophony of sound. Calves bawling, cows blaring, ducks quacking, crows cawing, pheasants crowing, turkeys gobbling, frogs croaking, and songbirds of every sort. It was truly a symphony of nature. I wanted more of the silence.

Sometimes silence can be our most effective language. Isn't it true that when prayer is at its best it often trails off into silence? Can it be that just at the point where words fail that our deepest prayer begins?

One of my teachers at seminary wrote these words that I cherish: The saddest and gladdest events go beyond the range of communication. The dimensions of our experience are too vast for utterance. Language breaks down at the moment when we most desire to communicate. But it is important to have an ear for silence and to understand the silences of others. There is a great comfort in knowing that, though we do not know how to pray as we ought, "the Spirit intercedes for us with sighs too deep for words".

I am sure that there have been times over the past two years that you have not been able to pray as you ought. You should know that when you have not been able to pray others have prayed for you. It's what we do as a congregation.

Pastor James is finishing up the first month of his sabbatical. We sent him off with seven-word prayers for him to use to remember us as we remember him in his journeys and time away. We pray that in the silences he encounters he will experience the Spirit interceding with sighs.

In the silence, what is God saying to us? In the silence of the morning, I could see the Wenatchee hills alive; the rains have turned the hillsides green, flowering plants and fruit trees have blossomed, some thriving, some not doing so well because of cold weather. However, it is amazing! We do not hear the march of the seasons or the rising of the sun. We do not hear the miracle of growth beneath our feet. I stood there, on my morning walk with my dog, listening to the sounds of life, offering thanks to the sometimes-silent God who is our refuge and strength.

Assembling a volunteer packing and moving team would mean a considerable financial savings.

Friends of Ukraine Refugees

At its meeting on May 10, the Wenatchee Ukrainian Refugee Committee agreed to incorporate. On May 11, its successor organization Friends of Ukraine Refugees was incorporated with the Secretary of State of the State of Washington. The following Board of Directors and Officers were elected: The Rev. Ernst T. Bentsen, Kay G. Fisher, Dee Ann Gregg as Treasurer, Philip A. Gregg, Marin Alejandra Hansen, Rev. Dr. Keith Madsen as Secretary, Fr. Michael Shanbour, Russell J. Speidel as President, Barbara Tilly, and Jon Volyn as Vice President.

Friends of Ukraine Refugees is a Washington Charitable Nonprofit Corporation, organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes to

benefit refugees from the war in Ukraine. Application has been filed with the IRS for 501(c)(3) recognition. Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws, Tax Identification Number, IRS Form 1023-EZ, and Business License Applications have all been completed and filed. The mailing address of Friends of Ukraine Refugees is Post Office Box 686, Wenatchee, WA 98807-0686.

Friends of Ukraine Refugees has successfully settled our first refugee family in a house under lease. The rent is being paid from funds awarded to Chelan County by the Department of Commerce of the State of Washington. We are actively in the process of completing paid leases for two more refugee families. There is a big push to use as much as possible of the \$286,000 grant from the State before it goes away on June 30.

In June, Friends of Ukraine Refugees will address the issue of whether to become a guarantor financial sponsor for additional refugees from the war in Ukraine. The purpose of acting as a guarantor would be to encourage more refugees from the war in Ukraine to settle in North Central Washington. Please keep us in your thoughts and prayers as we seek discernment. Thank you.

Fox Trust Visioning Team Update – May, 2022

The Fox Trust Visioning Team met for its monthly meeting on May 10, 2022. The team reviewed the report from Michael Hamilton on the GLC building inspection. It was encouraging to see there were no major/unexpected recommendations. The inspection report is currently in review by church council.

The Fox Trust Visioning Team received five nominations interested in filling an open position on the team. The team selected an individual to fill the seat vacated by a recent resignation. The team forwarded the name to church council for ratification. The decision to determine whether to add additional seats to the team was deferred to the next meeting. The names of the remaining four nominees will be considered in filling additional seats. We are still accepting volunteers to submit their names for appointment. If you are willing to consider serving, please contact one of the team members: John McQuaig, Judy Conner, Karen Zanol, Bob Bartlett, Milt Herman, Gwen Sparks, Cheryl Salter, and Joanne Dalinkus.

There was discussion at length for the need to identify an estimate of funds needed for improvements to the Church campus. This will allow establishing the criteria to identify available funds for support of the projects and missions of the Church. The plan would include the process that will be used to identify appropriate projects/organizations. The team will hold a special meeting, dedicating a longer block of time, for this discussion. The team will select an independent facilitator to work through this process.

Reopening Committee Update

In March 2020, at the direction of Congregational Council, the Reopening Committee of Grace Lutheran Church began biweekly Zoom meetings. The committee studied and evaluated Covid data to determine the timing of a safe return to in-person church services, events, and activities during a global pandemic. To facilitate the earliest and safest possible in-person return, the committee recommended measures needed to safeguard the health and safety of members and visitors. In a return to in-person participation, the priority of the committee was the consideration of all worshiping at GLC, and especially those most vulnerable and marginalized.

Input was received from a variety of sources including but not limited to congregants, church staff, synod, local medical organizations and professionals, and state and national (CDC) public health agencies. After thoughtful and prayerful consideration of the data, informed recommendations were made to Congregational Council. Although not every recommendation was adopted, the committee recognized the council as the deciding body ultimately responsible for the health and safety of the Grace Lutheran Church.

The Reopening Committee greatly appreciates the opportunity of serving Grace Lutheran Church in this capacity. We hope that the Congregational Council and congregation will continue to consider those members and visitors who remain vulnerable whether during a pandemic or in life circumstances. May we continue to serve those in need and to speak for those whose voice is unheard. May we continue to grow as a congregation that is reconciling in Christ.
