Rest, Renew, Recreate

People of Grace;

This newsletter covers the months of June and July. I hope you will read about opportunities for your faith to be nurtured through the summer. I also hope you will take note of opportunities to share in fellowship, and be in service to the world, even if it's to a relatively small part of the world.

Also, summer is an opportunity to change your pace of life. In Christ, God lifts us up to new life. In Christ, there can be unexpected and unexplained joy in simply "being." I ask that you notice those opportunities, those moments when the Spirit of Jesus is inviting you to rest, renew, and be recreated.

This is not resting time for all of us... some who are heavily involved in agriculture work at a feverish pace in the summer months. For others, the seasons do not change their working life. There are many "and how about" examples that pretty much negate the whole concept of summer rest. It's good for us all to be aware of that.

Yet, there is something that changes in us when the seasons change, and there are moments we can carry with us through the rest of our lives. One year ago (already? Yikes!) my wife and I were having a time of renewal in Ireland. A rejuvenating rhythm of learning, walking, conversing, and resting was just what we needed. I still reflect on that time and give God thanks for the chance to step out of some of my callings for the sake of being able to return to them with joy and new energy.

Here are a few ideas you might consider as you enter summertime.

Early morning, come to Grace and prayerfully walk our labyrinth.

Pick up a book you have been considering for a while, perhaps a book that helps your faith mature. Read slowly, meditatively, so that you are not trying to check another thing off a list, but rather, you are sitting in communion with the Holy Spirit.

Experiment with walking to worship. "What? Walk from my home to church? That's too far!" Good point! Instead, park one block away from Grace, get a few steps in, and enjoy the beauty of the morning. You might even "bump" into a fellow member!

Try "Dwelling in the Word" at Grace during July and August. You'll find a longer introduction in this newsletter. Be a helper for Vacation Bible School.

Have a stroll in our community garden.

Take time in our memorial garden. Pick a name you see printed there, give God thanks for the life that was lived in that person.

Spend time at a community gathering place (Pybus Market, for example), and walk people meditatively, praying for them as they pass by. Try something a little more extroverted and strike up a conversation where you intentionally represent the love of God to the neighbor.

GARDEN TEAM REPORT

The Garden Team: Sue Garness, Judy Olson, Dean O'Daffer and Linda Sinnett hope everyone takes time to check out the progress on the garden. All 8 boxes are prepared for planting and the area on the west side of the garage/shop has been weeded. The native bushes that were planted last year are thriving. The plan was to plant vegetables in the boxes in late May but unfortunately our supplier was unable to deliver the plants for our last work party. We now have a planting work party scheduled for June 10th, 8:00 to 11:00.

Sheila Wellman, a student at Wenatchee Valley College, has been hired as the Garden Manager. Sheila has been taking classes in Agriculture/Natural Resources for a few years. Her knowledge and experience have already proved to be very beneficial to our project.

More than a project this is a mission. The garden will support our Little Free Pantry with fresh produce, as well as provide vegetables to members of the congregation. We plan to reach out to immediate and valley-wide neighbors and collaborate with other local community gardens. We hope to learn and teach more about food security, food justice and care of the earth. The garden will be used for education of Wenatchee area elementary students and to supplement Agriculture classes at Wenatchee Valley College. This is also a constructive use of a large area of church property that was otherwise not utilized. To be sustainable volunteers are needed to share the work with the garden team.


