Worship Music – a Different Kind of Sound

Dear friends in Christ,

For some, worship is about music. Others are less interested in the music of their church. There’s no doubt that music elicits a level of emotion which other sounds of worship cannot reach. Music is an important part of our congregational life. When the assembly is singing a beloved old (or new) hymn, it’s a fantastic sound.

When I began my call with you in 2013, we did not have full-time leadership for our music ministry. In many of my conversations about the congregation during that time, music ministry was the most pressing topic. I believe the congregation was experiencing an identity crisis then (“if we’re not about our music, then who are we?”). I had feelings of disappointment about that, because our other wonderful ministries done in the name of Christ tended to be overlooked. Yes, when many in the community mention our church, they speak about the music-related events we have (or provide space for). It’s clear that Grace Lutheran has “made a name” for itself in this valley over the years. There is a powerful and significant ministry that happens through our music. God speaks through our music. The Holy Spirit is present there, filling our hearts with praise, but there’s more to say about music as a means by which we engage with the word of God.

Please keep in mind that with our worship, music is not so much of an experience in itself - it’s a way to encounter something deeper in our spirits. With our music ministry and the rest of our worship planning, we want music to be one of the ways by which we invite one another to engage with the word of God, in particular, with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We want our worshipers to have a deeper experience with God *through* music.

How about styles of music? Whatever style we happen to use, it’s for the sake of supporting the worship of the assembly. Even musical offerings such as choral anthems are meant to point the people toward Christ. We like to avoid talking about performance of music in worship. Instead, we want to serve and support the worship of this congregation.

When we use music in worship, we join together to make something beautiful. That beauty isn’t in the notes as much as it’s in the togetherness experienced by the congregation, assembled in worship. Music is a wonderful resource to help us reach that end.

- If you're unfamiliar with a piece of music, be patient with yourself and give yourself permission to try anyway. You are not being judged. You are not performing.



Losing and Finding

As I sit at the computer, the news is flooded with loss. Tornadoes in the Southeast, three burned churches in Louisiana, literal flooding in Idaho, Nebraska, Iowa, and Missouri, the signature cathedral in Paris, Nôtre-Dame is damaged, plus all the ‘regular’ things in the news: loss of lives, loss of civility in politics, loss of momentum in the economy of the world, loss of hope- loss upon loss upon loss.

It is also Holy Week, which will be completed by the time you read this in the newsletter. All the work of the staff, members of teams, choirs, and others who put significant time and resources into making the most precious week in the church calendar successful.

Of course, we measure success differently in churches! Do you think it’s about how the lack of problems or mistakes, the correct execution of the liturgical services, the timing of all the various parts of the week coming together will successfully welcome Jesus our King? No.

I rejoice that Jesus will come on Easter morning, back to us again and again, even if the flowers were wilted, the candles blew out, you were crowded in your usual pew space, or the intern missed a prayer or cue. Christ is RISEN! God makes all things happen. Try as we might, we can’t raise Jesus from the tomb by performing our parts perfectly. Honestly, we can’t. Nor are we passive actors in an immense drama, or often comedy, but our actions correct or futile will not effect the will of God.¹

Finding is the opposite of loss. We will find ourselves and our roles for the church and the world. We do that by listening and looking for ways to help our neighbors. We find our way by seeking a better path, through studying Scripture, praying consistently, and holding our hands out in front of us.

Jesus tells us in the Gospels that **“For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it.”** Matt 16:25. The paradox of living a Christian life, in which we die each day to sin and are resurrected again each day with Christ, is following the example that Jesus sets for us. We are the lost sheep who are found, the broken beggars who are healed, the blind whose eyes are opened by Jesus.

Easter is not a door or gate for us to pass through, but a constant beacon that we can look back on, or look towards, when we are unsure of where we are. If we are lost, or struggling, or standing on shaky ground, we always know where we can be found... with Christ Jesus.

Blessings for the time after Easter as we move towards Pentecost!



Council Corner

1. King’s Garden Preschool (a ministry of Lighthouse Ministries) use of GLC space has been appointed as an in-kind donation from GLC to Lighthouse Ministries, effective May 2019.
2. Members of the Pastoral Support Committee (Micah Florea and Julie Banken) presented a proposal for Pastor Aalgaard’s twelve-week sabbatical for summer of 2020. Council to make a decision at May meeting.
3. Council formulating a proposal of new sanctuary lighting project in response from church members asking to have better lighting in the Grace Sanctuary. Estimated cost of \$60,000-\$65,000. Plan to inform congregation to be decided at May meeting.
4. Financial Advisory Board convened by Treasurer Gwen Sparks provided council with initial ideas for possible set limits Grace should maintain as cash on hand. This is in response to the January Congregation meeting where the amount of savings at Grace was inquired about “what is needed to operate in a fiscally-responsible manner and be prepared to face an emergency or financial downturn.” Advisory board to meet again in May and provide recommendations to Council.
