“Love your neighbor.” (From Luke 10:27)

Dear friends in Christ,

I’ve been thinking, it’s a radical thing to love one’s neighbor. I don’t suppose I do so well at this, but I know Jesus, and I know his directives in this area, and I pray for the Spirit to open my life up more and give me the capacity to love.

How do we define “neighbor?” It seems to be straightforward – a neighbor is someone nearby. However, a neighbor is anyone who is not you. Do you have a spouse? Neighbor. Do you have a child? Neighbor. Do you have a coworker? Neighbor. Is there someone around you whose first language is not English? Neighbor.

Jesus teaches us to do more than tolerate, get along with, and put up with our neighbor. Love is a mighty strong word that calls us to humility and the willingness to sacrifice for the well being of the neighbor. It’s greater than respect and honor. Love your neighbor.

I think the core value of service is a calling we feel: to love our many communities. This perspective is built into our ministry structure as a congregation; we have a Social Concerns Team, for example, which represents our congregation to a handful of organizations through financial gifts and relationships. Even providing our building for other groups to meet is an expression of love. You may feel that you have a choice about who gets to be your neighbor, but that’s only partly true. A neighbor you avoid, or dislike, is still your neighbor. A neighbor who sees the world in ways you cannot understand is still your neighbor. You are to love them. Yikes. This neighbor stuff might just be transformative.

Sabbatical Planning

Earlier this year, in accordance with our pastoral sabbatical policy, the church council approved a 3-month sabbatical for Pastor James, to take place May through July, 2020. The Pastoral Support Team has met with Pastor James several times throughout the year to collaborate and help with the planning process.

Pastoral sabbaticals have a deep-rooted tradition of extending vibrant and healthy ministry by providing a dedicated time for pastoral growth and training, rejuvenation, and refocused vision. In addition to pastoral benefits, sabbaticals provide an opportunity for congregational growth and renewal. Intern Jenna is actively training and will be prepared to step into many of the pastoral responsibilities during the sabbatical.

The Pastoral Support Team plans to host informational gatherings at the beginning of the coming year to share more about the sabbatical, answer questions, and allow Pastor James to share his developing plans and vision for this special time. An update from the Reconciling in Christ group

On October 20, 18 GLC members came together to discuss our continuing process to become a Reconciling in Christ congregation. Over the past 18 months, we have offered educational opportunities and discussion groups, including a session with Aubrey Thonvold, executive director of Reconciling Works. Our next step in the process is to conduct an Exploratory Survey of the congregation. Please keep in mind that becoming a RIC congregation means that we will be open and welcoming to all people – people of color, people of all abilities, ... ALL PEOPLE. Ultimately, we will create our own welcome statement which reflects the diversity of our community. The statement below is for feedback only. Boodry Street Family Update

In August, Grace Lutheran Church had an opportunity to help a family that was flooded out of their home the first part of August. Grace Lutheran Church took a special offering and started collecting items for a new place to live. The following is an update on the family.

Erika and Jose and their three children have been living with relatives and friends for almost two months. The week of October 7th they finally found a place to rent. They moved into a two-bedroom duplex in East Wenatchee and the Wenatchee School District has agreed to transport the three children each day to and from Wenatchee's Mission View School in order to keep some continuity in their uprooted lives.

Plastic Bag Sleeping Mats for the Homeless

Members of our church will be utilizing used plastic bags by cutting them into strips, tying them together and crocheting them to make sleeping mats for the homeless. The following is a list of materials that are needed to make the sleeping mats.

- Plastic bags (500-700 grocery bags) per mat
- Knitting needles (size 10 or higher) or crochet needles (Q recommended)
- Scissors

The Mat Project is in need of people to crochet the mats. November Featured Benevolence

Women's Resource Center

The Women's Resource Center provides individuals and families experiencing poverty and homelessness with the housing and supportive services they need to be part of a healthy, diverse community.

The Women's Resource Center currently operates the following programs:

Permanent Supportive Housing

Parkside Apartments is a 15-unit facility that houses individuals who were previously, chronically homeless, have a diagnosed mental illness and earn less than 30 percent of the Area Median Income (AMI). Parkside operates using the Housing First Model. We also have funding for seven scattered site Permanent Supportive Housing units that operate on the same model. Leases are written in the tenants' names and they pay rent on a sliding scale.

Bruce Transitional Housing

The Bruce Hotel in downtown Wenatchee, is home to families and individuals transitioning out of homelessness. Households are eligible for services up to 24-months; however, we start working with families right away to get them on track to exit to stable housing as soon as possible. Households must earn 30 percent or less of the Area Median Income (AMI). Residents are required to attend resident meetings, participate in self-sufficiency planning with case managers, abstain from using drugs and alcohol and perform chores. Residents are subject to drug and alcohol testing. There is a monthly program fee.

Homeless Street Outreach

Every weekday the Women's Resource Center Outreach Team hits the streets with USDA approved meals, water, hygiene products, information and a listening ear. While the goal of Outreach is to persuade people to come in and be housed, there is a certain percentage who, for a host of reasons, refuse. The Outreach Team can at least make sure they have some of their most basic needs covered and track folks to monitor potential health and safety problems. The Outreach Team has been very successful in engaging with folks and creating the kinds of relationships that turn lives around.

Landlord Tenant Liaison Program

The Wenatchee Valley Landlord Tenant Liaison Program (WV-LTL) is part of the City of Wenatchee's Ten-Year Plan to end homelessness. Since Chelan and Douglas Counties are unable to build enough new rental properties to address our housing shortage, we are partnering with private landlords in our community to rent to our most vulnerable clients. The WV-LTL is looking for private landlords who are willing to rent to households who have rental barriers such as past eviction, criminal background or bad credit, often due to circumstances not within their control.

Each month GLC gives \$150.00 to Women's Resource Center to support their programs.

Grace Memorial Garden

The Grace Memorial Garden Committee would like to remind the congregation that there are still niches available in our lovely Columbarium. We would like to share some thoughts with you about making this decision. No one really wants to think about designating a spot for their cremains. However, it does take a burden off of family members when such a decision has been made early and everyone is thinking clearly, rather than when emotions are involved, and questions come up about the wishes of the loved one who has passed. It leads to a sense of peace for families if all has been arranged in advance. So please be thinking if you or your family would like to be among those whose final resting place is in Grace Lutheran Church's Memorial Garden. There are informational packets available in the copy room. Blessings to you as you consider this important decision! Please visit our sacred garden anytime you wish to remember a loved one or friend interred there, or when you need a peaceful place for prayer.

SIMPLY GIVING

Simply Giving is an automatic offering method provided by Thrivent Financial for Lutherans. It is open to anyone and **YOU WILL NOT BE CONTACTED BY THRIVENT**. Vanco Services is the company that administers the plan and Thrivent's only connection is to pay the administrative fee for us. Thrivent has no access to the names of people who are signed up for the service.

And it is easy to sign up. Just see Roxanne, the Finance Manager, and she will help you fill out and sign a simple form, or you can have a form e-mailed to you. Please bring a voided copy of one of your checks and she will do the rest. You can make monthly payments on any day of the month except the 31st since not every month has 31 days. You may also make weekly, biweekly, quarterly, and annual payments if you wish. Your payment can be credited to the budget and other accounts that you may wish to fund. The charge can be made to either your checking or savings account, or to a credit or debit card.

So, it's quick, it's easy, and it allows you to give regularly as you have pledged to give. If you are interested or have further questions, please feel free to call Roxanne at any time. Her regular office hours are Monday 8-1:30, Tuesday 11:30-5, Thursday 11:30-3:30.

A note for all current Simply Giving/Vanco givers, please submit your commitment/pledge cards. Even though you are set up on regular giving, we can't use this to fill out your pledge/commitment cards for you. This helps in our budget planning for the coming year.

"It Takes a Village"

We all know that age-old saying. But how much do we recognize it or live by it? I was recently at Holden Village where that expression truly manifests itself in the everyday rhythms of mealtime, sending and receiving people and worship. In this literal "village," you really see it. I had the privilege of being there for their bi-annual "Barge Day" when staff, volunteers and guests are all invited to help "chain" (pass from one person to the next) the many pallets of goods that came up Lake Chelan and made their way to the main lodge to supply the Village through the winter. We chained everything from 50-lb bags of flour and rice to #10 cans of tomatoes, laundry soap and toilet paper (wow - so much toilet paper). It was fun to take part in "Barge Day", complete with music, dancing and special bonding with your fellow "chain-mates" next to you. At a place like Holden, there's a closeness you feel with everyone, but the sense of survival and dependence also feels more pronounced, necessitating that "village" mentality. And yet, I think Christ calls us into that kind of living everyday and everywhere.

Sometimes it can be challenging being one person in a village of many; other times, it's wonderfully humbling. Since arriving at Grace and moving to this new village (from my former "village" of 7.2 million people in Hong Kong), I have felt incredibly welcomed and cared for on many accounts. It's been particularly fun to discover who helped put together the vicarage where I live - dishware from the McQuaigs, artwork from Trish Simmons and a bedroom set built by Jim Caulkins (just to name a few!). That place truly has a sense of "home" for me and reminds me of the ways in which I have received from people here and from others in villages around the world. It has also inspired me to give thanks and share that space for meals and people who need a place to stay in an effort to pay it forward. Even so, I know I can always do more - in giving to others, as well as asking for help!

In our individualistic society, the village mentality can be quite counter-cultural. I often find myself trying to do things by my own efforts, but Christ desires us to live in community with our neighbors and lean on God, together. "Where two or more are gathered" is a call to the closeness and vibrancy of village life and to the act of worship that comes out of being in relationship with our neighbor.

So who is - or could be - in your "village"? How do you live into the "village" mentality - both in giving and receiving/asking? In what ways could you live more fully into the village life, God's Kingdom Come, in which Christ calls us all to take part?
