Bubbling Over

People of Grace;

I received a phone call the other night from a leader of the Friends of Ukrainian Refugees. A situation had arisen where a family with many kids had found a home to rent, but they could not come up with all the money needed in deposits. These leaders had been sharing this information with a supporter from the community. The amount needed was something like \$4,500. This supporter, with very little hesitation, said "I would like to take care of that," and provided for the deposits right there, on the spot. The adult male from this Ukrainian family has a source of income as a construction worker, but the deposits made getting into that rental out of reach. This was a blessing that felt beyond measure. The people sharing this news with me were bubbling over with amazement and gratitude. They just had to tell someone, and I was blessed to receive the news.

Gifts like that are, shall we say, "eye-popping". Some are able to make such a contribution, and some are not. When you are deciding what to give for the well being of the neighbor, you might feel hesitant if your gift cannot match what you hear or think others are giving. Guilt and shame sneak into our self assessment and we may choose the path of doing nothing even though we feel prompted to give. Comparisons can be insidious.

Our youth director Beth shared there were 25 people at a recent Wenatchee Youth Community gathering. Although it had been a long day of ministry and she was a "good" kind of tired, she was bubbling over.

October 12, I shared about my recent sabbatical with 70 people. I was so amazed at that number, and was bubbling over.

This is a month where we pay attention to the practice of gratitude. In what ways could your gratitude bubble over? Is there something you can do for the well being of a neighbor? Have you ever witnessed someone bubbling over with gratitude for you? Or for some way you have helped? Dwell in those memories for a while.

Seeking Worship Helpers



Flower Chart



Make A Difference Day – Saturday, October 23rd, 2022

Make A Difference Day was, Saturday, October 23rd, 2022. The Social Concerns Team did a couple of projects this year.



- 1. Cold Weather Drive at Pybus Public Market The team collected new and used hats and gloves for the students of the Eastmont and Wenatchee School Districts, and the homeless in the Wenatchee Valley.
- 2. Repackaging coats after Make A Difference Day and distributing the coats to area Schools. The SCT, congregation members of Grace, and the Wenatchee and Eastmont High School girls swim teams worked with Serve Wenatchee Valley collecting school age children's coats, sorted the coats according to age and sex, then packaged the coats according to a list that was submitted by each school. Over 1,000 coats were distributed to area schools in the Eastmont and Wenatchee School districts.

WHS Students Experiencing Homelessness Christmas Gift Cards:

The Social Concerns Team is collecting gift cards for the Students of Wenatchee High School experiencing homelessness. You can help by doing one of the following!

- 1. There are tags on the Christmas tree in the foyer from which you can select. Each tag lists a place of business and a dollar amount of the gift card to be purchased. Bring back your purchased gift card and gift card receipt to the church. Place the gift cards along the gift receipt in the box labeled "WHS Homeless Gift Cards".
- 2. You can write a check to Grace Lutheran Church for the amount you would like to donate. In the memo line be sure to write WHS Homeless Students Gift Cards.

Our goal is to provide 40 to 50 students with a Christmas package containing a WHS T-shirt and a variety of useful gift cards so they may have a very Merry Christmas.


