## “Each Person Has a Gift to Share” – Jean Vanier

Dear friends in Christ,

We are in a program year in which we focus on our core value of service. Our three values tend to flow into one another. I think it makes sense to understand these as a process, or flow: The Holy Spirit calls us together in worship to praise God, rest and receive nourishment in word and sacrament – through our common experience we get a sense of the gift of being in community with one another, and we begin to rely on one another in deeper and deeper ways – we respond to God’s nourishment and the gift of community by being in service in the world.

What if you don’t feel able to be of service in the world? What if you’re exhausted, in pain, or overwhelmed in any way, and getting yourself up and going each day is about all you can do? What if you would really like to serve, but cannot for the life of you think of what usable gifts you have to share? There are biblical lists of spiritual gifts that can help us know our own giftedness, but even those might seem out of reach. Please know, grace abounds here, and even your presence, prayers, and interest are ways you are contributing to the work of God in the world. Here’s a list of other gifts you might explore, curated by author Jean Vanier in “Community and Growth:”

1. The gift of listening. As listener, you can offer the safety of confidentiality, “knowing how to respect the wounds and the sufferings of others.”
2. The gift of discernment. One who discerns “can seize what is essential in a complicated discussion or a confused story.”
3. Fidelity over time. The older communities, who have been faithful and engaged for generations “without making too much noise about it” have a lot of wisdom to offer.
4. The gift of wonderment. “People who have spent a long time in community tend to forget what is beautiful in it... They need to be renewed by listening to the sense of wonder in the younger people who feel called to commit themselves to the community.”
5. The gift of the ‘grandmother’. These have “a fund of commonsense... ‘grandmothers’ sense certain things. And there are things which can be confided only to them... the same could be said about wise ‘grandfathers’.”

6. The gift of animation. Bringing voice to a collective need or desire of the community. “We have to be aware all the time of what people are really waiting for and we have to respond to this secret, silent wish.”
7. The gift of availability. This is the willingness to respond to leadership and the community, to “step up” and realize that certain gifts are identified in you by others, even if you do not feel confident. To be available is to also be trusting of the expressed needs of the leadership and the community.

It’s a very different list of gifts, one that seems to have more to do with “being” than “doing”. Let there be space inside your spirit for a new discovery this year. You have an important part in the body of Christ.

## Make A Difference Day – Saturday, October 26, 2019 - 10:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.

Saturday, October 26<sup>th</sup>, is Make A Difference Day. This year, Grace Lutheran Church is sponsoring two projects:

- **PowerHouse Ministries** is in need of supplies. They serve 20 to 70 people each day, and all their services are free. As you might imagine, they use up a lot of supplies. The following is a list of items they need:
  - Socks, underwear
  - Winter coats, scarves, gloves
  - Sleeping bags, blankets, sleeping mats, tarps, backpacks, tents
  - Paper plates, cups, bowls, plastic knives, forks, spoons
  - Soap, shampoo, conditioner, body wash, lotion
  - Bath towels, wash cloths, razors, shaving cream
  - Toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant
  - Cup of noodles, peanut butter, jelly, bread, butter, cookies
  - Bibles, daily devotional booklets
  - Bus tokens, tall kitchen bags, full size garbage bags
  - Feminine products, high efficiency laundry soap, dryer sheets
  - Ground Coffee, creamers, sugar, large coffee filters
  - Toilet paper, napkins, paper towels
  - Lightly used clothing for men, women, and children

- **Turning Plastic bags into Sleeping Mats for the Homeless:**

Who doesn't have a drawer-closet-basket chock full of plastic bags just screaming to be recycled and upcycled? Why not combine your plastic bag stash with a community service project to benefit local shelters and the homeless in your area? This is a wonderful project where children and adults of all ages can combine their creativity, talents and labor to provide sleeping mats for individuals and organizations in need to weather the elements all by using plastic yarn made from plastic bags.

Members of our church will be utilizing used plastic bags by cutting them into strips, tying them together and crocheting them to make sleeping mats for the homeless. We are need of people to cut the bags and tie the ends together.

### **Materials To Make A Sleep Mat From Plastic Bags**

Plastic bags (500-700 grocery bags) per mat

Knitting needles (size 10 or higher) or crochet needles (Q recommended)

Scissors

# October Featured Benevolence

## PowerHouse Ministries

PowerHouse was founded in November of 2011 by Shalom Church of Wenatchee to help meet the pressing needs of people in our community who are dealing with problems such as alcoholism, drug addiction, mental illness, poverty, gangs, and homelessness.

PowerHouse is not intended to be identified with any one church, but Shalom Church needed to get things started. To accomplish this, PowerHouse was established to be a cooperative Christian ministry center where several different churches and Christians of all types came together to minister to the broken, hurting, poor, and addicted. As PowerHouse serves the real needs of people, their desire and purpose is to be a witness to Jesus Christ and His life-changing power.

PowerHouse aims to be Christ-centered, biblically based, and outreach oriented.

Since their opening in 2011, PowerHouse has had volunteers from at least 10 different churches in the Wenatchee Valley volunteer at PowerHouse. The various beliefs and practices of each of our volunteers and their churches are respected and valued.

Each month GLC gives \$150.00 to PowerHouse Ministries to support their programs.



## FELLOWSHIP TEAM

Your Fellowship Team has the pleasure of serving all of you after each service (one in the summer -- two throughout the rest of the year). In addition, we also support special events, of which there have been 8 so far, with about 4 or more until the end of 2019. Some of the team also assist with Memorial Services. As the team leader, I keep the kitchen stocked, purchase products for Sundays as well as special events, help keep the kitchen clean and whatever else needs to be done. Planning and coordinating are also part of being a team leader and I am privileged to work with 22 members of our congregation on the team. Each team member is responsible for service they attend and we all pitch in for the summer service. One of the most remarkable things that happened last winter is the Council made the decision to add a second service which, of course, meant many more volunteers to handle everything that had been 1 was now 2. I was so happy that so many people were willing to be on the team and help with their chosen service. I do not have regular meetings (people are really busy), so we keep in touch with email, snail mail and telephone. We also have a tablet on the refrigerator in the kitchen where folks write needed items, which I check on a regular basis.

Thank you to each and everyone of you!

I also would like to take this opportunity to thank Pastor James, and all of the staff. They never say no, are always there to help with a smile. Without them, as a volunteer here at Grace, I would not have the joy in volunteering I experience.

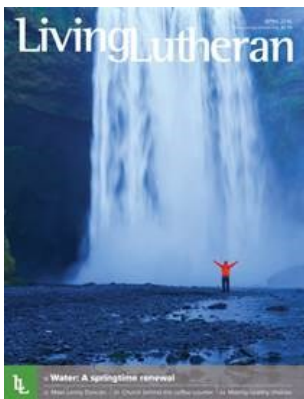
When I first arrived in Wenatchee during the last week of August, I was thrilled with the weather. It was bright and sunny for a solid two weeks until a couple of “weird” (or so I was told, for this area) storms rocked the Valley. Then we started to experience cooler temps, but that didn’t stop me from getting out to run, hike, and bike around to explore my new home. I also started noticing different fruits and vegetables at the Farmers Market, got my first pumpkin latte at Starbucks, and moved my hats and scarves to a more accessible spot. Fall is here, people!

Moving to the Wenatchee Valley and becoming part of the community at Grace Lutheran has been a significant change for me. My rhythms have changed, as has my work and the people who surround me. I no longer hear Cantonese or Mandarin, I don’t eat with chopsticks anymore, and I’m not the tallest person in a crowd (OK, maybe that one is still sometimes true). I’ve also left communities and roles within them that shaped me for the past four years. It would be dishonest to say that I haven’t mourned and faced challenges with some of the changes I’ve faced since I left Hong Kong. But, as with the changing seasons, we all have the opportunity to embrace both loss and gain with the changes in our lives.

How have you experienced changing seasons, lately? Perhaps you’ve lost your job or entered into a new relationship, seen the last of your children leave the nest, or started taking a new medication. Whether you’ve seen pronounced change or a subtle shift in your daily rhythm, it’s important to reflect on the ways in which life unfolds and “feel those feels”! God is with you through every changing season of your life and God wants to be in relationship with you through the mountains and the valleys.



God also gives us the gift of community to help navigate the changes of our lives. The church is not a place for perfect beings, but a place to be real and raw. You, the people of Grace, have welcomed me with the widest arms, inviting me into your lives and a new season of my own. I give thanks for you and the ways in which God has called me to be here with you. As we move forward together, I pray that we embody Christ as a community that takes time to breathe deeply into the high’s and low’s of new seasons - for one another, and for our neighbors.
