It All Hinges On...

"On these two commandments hang the entire law and the prophets." (from Matthew 22)

Dear friends in Christ,

My front door was bugging me. The top hinge had a squeak that would have been a great sound effect for A. Hitchcock. Lucky for me, I have a supply of WD-40. A few quick shots of that wonderous stuff eliminated my problem, masked-over the rubbing of metal on metal. Peace and tranquility returned to our front entrance, along with a lovely fragrance that brought me back to my childhood life on the farm.

Everyday objects can take on a kind of super-meaning when we apply them to other parts of life. To "hinge" on something is to be reliant on something else, to perhaps "swing" from a stable and grounded base. Even the word "depend" is from old Latin meaning "to hang down from."

This is a good month to fill in the blank of "it all hinges on _____". I'm living squarely in the near future, the day or weeks after November 3rd, and my breathing is getting shallow as I think about the super-charged emotions (some of them mine) that are painting awful pictures of our national life. Regardless of your concerns and your own way of loving your nation, you can very easily finish your thought with, "…it all hinges on the election."

Will we be back to in-person worship at Grace this fall? It all hinges on what phase our community is in, and the comfort of the leadership of the congregation. Will you return to public life? You might be one who says, "It all hinges on whether there's a vaccine for the general public." Will students get back to in-person learning? It all hinges on the case-count and certainly other factors. Will local restaurants and other businesses be able to recover from the shutdown? It all hinges on government stimulus efforts, the willingness of the public to frequent their businesses, and the costs of keeping their businesses going, and other factors of which I'm unaware.

There's so much weight, so much stress on the hinges of our world. We are metal-on-metal. We're having primal reactions to these stresses. If only WD-40 had a product for souls and psyches.

Matthew 22 has religious lawyers asking Jesus which of the commandments are the greatest. Might as well cut to the chase. Which one is the crown jewel, Jesus? His reply cuts through all neighborly squabbles, all political posturing, all dystopian prognosticating, attaching the human heart to the original, First Grounding: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind." What great news. November 3rd, I shall remember the First Commandment. December 3rd, likewise. January 3rd, February 3rd and so on.

Like the proverbial squeaky wheel, there's a hinge in our hearts calling for our attention. I'm pretty sure it's that second one, the one Jesus says is like the first. You are required to love the neighbor. Yes, it gets complicated, but you can do it, because the One who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world. May God hold us back from being unhinged. May our love for neighbor bring us all to a new and deeper sense of shared community.

All We Need Is Love

Well, Grace, it's already been a month since I first met you! And in spite of the fact that we haven't been able to meet in person I feel like you've got to know me pretty well. You've learned that I love poetry and have a fondness for music. You've learned that I'm a pretty huge nerd and that I could probably talk about theology all day. You've learned that I love exploring nature and that I'm overjoyed to have just gotten married.

And in that time I've been able to learn a lot about this congregation. I've learned that Grace is a place that will organize a drive-thru meet-and-greet so that they can get to know you even during a pandemic. I've learned that Grace is a church focused on creating a loving, inclusive, and uplifting community. I've learned that this church loves music and rejoices in learning! I've learned that Grace is a congregation that sets up a Little Free Food Pantry for its neighborhood in the middle of a pandemic. And I've learned that as the world around the church has become increasingly complex and filled with change, Grace has chosen to enter the world and face these changes head-on.

These coming months are going to be incredibly difficult. We're entering into an incredibly divisive election season. We learn every day of new atrocities and oppressions committed against people of color, people of diverse genders and sexualities, and people of lower classes. We will need to consider how to assist the areas of the West Coast states that have been devastated by wildfires and discover better ways to care for our creation. We will have to decide how we shall live out Christ's call during a pandemic. Any one of these challenges would be enough to be overwhelming, and we've got them all at once. Often I find myself wondering how Christ's call impels us to act in such confusing and overwhelming times.

In his poem "September 1st, 1939" — written about the beginning of World War II — W. H. Auden concludes the penultimate stanza with the affirmation: "we must love one another or die." I've been turning that over in my head often in recent weeks, and thinking about how much that aligns with our call from Christ. At the heart of Christ's teaching and sacrifice is the message that we are on this earth to love one another, for the consequences of living without love are quite severe. And my first month at Grace has shown me that this is a church capable of meeting an overwhelming world with the overwhelming love of God. So, Grace, I look forward to taking on the challenges of the modern world with you as we confront big decisions and determine how we must show courageous and active love to one another. It's going to be difficult, but with God guiding us, I know that we can help this community, country, and world become a more loving place.

The Little Essential Pantry opened on Monday, September 21 and is located at the front entrance of the church under the breezeway. There are two cabinets - one is for food items and the other is for cleaning supplies, paper supplies, and personal hygiene items. This pantry is open and accessible to all, from **10 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday**. We will continue to need your donations to support this project. Fox Trust Monies: The past six months the Social Concerns Team has been busy getting things ready for the Fox Trust Monies. In May, we set up an account for any monies that are donated to the Social Concerns Team. These monies can include memorial donations or any monetary gifts. *Cash position in 2019 is reduced by \$40,000 which funded Special Projects.

Cash position continues to fund losses. It is anticipated the SBA Payroll Protection Program loan \$72,300 will fund these losses once the loan is forgiven. For the month of August income and expenses are slightly above breakeven \$760 for the first time since COVID closure started.

Comparison to 2020 budget. Total receipts are \$267,508 through August, (\$75,825) less than budget project. Likewise expenses \$315,533 are (\$43,446) less than projected. Net variance is (\$32,369) comparing actual to budget.

It is again time to start the budget process for 2021. Budget requests will shortly be sent out to all Team Leads. It should be some interesting discussions. There are opportunities with many unknowns. God's guidance will continue to lead!!!!
