### Pastor's Message

Dear friends,

There are many "irons in the fire" as some of our grandparents would sometimes say. I pray that these short bullet points will be informative for you. Here at Grace, we try to get communication out to folks but sometimes drop the ball. The advertising people say effective communication means saying the same thing seven times, all through different means if we want to get the message across. That is a tall order!

- Church Council would like to be in conversation with the congregation about our core values and our mission statement. These statements can be helpful guides for the purpose of our congregation. As one consultant says: "These statements are a kind of compass heading, rather than a road map. Conditions change from year to year, but these statements help us understand our desired destination."
- A Wenatchee resident (and student of Luther Seminary), Dane Breslin, has been serving a half-time internship at Lake Chelan Lutheran Church. He is at a transition point now, needing to have internship learning opportunities in our community. Grace will be involved in his internship, as will a few other local churches from other Christian traditions. I would like us to see Dane as our Valley Intern. Our current fulltime intern, Anna Ferro, will continue to be our traditional intern. It's exciting to acknowledge that we are a learning community! Please welcome Dane and his family when you see them at Grace.
- We have hired a person to help with our music ministry for the Advent and Christmas season. Sean Burns is a local resident, recently moved to the area, and former music minister serving in California. I hope you have a chance to say hi to Sean soon! You can stay tuned for invitations and information on how you can be involved in that special church season. We are waiting until the congregation approves the 2022 budget next January to proceed with a search for a permanent part-time person.
- I have switched a few dates around related to my sabbatical for 2022. Next July, I will have an opportunity to be in Tanzania with our sister synod the UKD (Ulanga Kilombero Diocese). You may remember Pastor Moses Nwaka, who visited our church some years ago. I will spend some of my time at the Tumaini Lutheran School there.
- Intern Anna and I were planning to attend the Bishop's Convocation in October, with Presiding Bishop Eaton as one of the keynote speakers. This event has been canceled because of the progression of the pandemic. It is sad to not have the opportunity to check in with and support (and receive the support and blessing of) colleagues in ministry from our synod.
- Regular offerings to our general fund for the ministries of the congregation are below what we planned; the drop from our planned deficit for 2021 is approximately \$45,000. The Holy Spirit is speaking to us through this financial information, but we who are in leadership are guessing about what the message is. I invite you to reach out to me or a church council member if you can help us with insights in this matter. As a follow up, I trust you are considering what your stewardship commitment will be for next year.

Thank you to all who have responded to our recent survey on vaccination status. As of this writing (9/21), 180 of us have returned either an email or hard copy survey. We are collecting surveys through 9/26. Intern Anna Ferro is compiling the results, and we will announce the results once all surveys have been processed. The committee is most grateful to Anna for making this important survey happen.

Thank you GLC attendees for your faithfulness in following guidelines that allow us to remain open for in-person worship and communion during this difficult time. The response to in-person worship has been gratifying as masked congregants fill our socially distanced pews and masked musicians offer choral and instrumental gifts. We encourage everyone to continue making reservations each week for the seventy-five seats available at worship. The delta variant has meant our hospital is full and our healthcare workers are challenged. We encourage everyone who can be vaccinated to be vaccinated.

Your reopening committee continues to meet twice monthly and to stay up to date on information available to us from the Chelan Douglas Health District, the Washington State Department of Health, and Confluence Health, as well as from the Northwest Intermountain Synod and Bishop Kuempel. The committee includes three MD's in addition to lay members, a staff member, our intern, and Pastor James. We pray for the good health of our community and congregation.

Make A Difference Day is Saturday, October 23rd, 2021. The Social Concerns Team is doing a couple of projects this year.

- 1. Cold Weather Drive at Pybus Public Market We will be collecting new and used Adult Coats, boots, socks, Hats, Gloves, Hand and Feet Warmers, Reusable Water Bottles, Hand Sanitizers and Face Masks. *For your convenience, there will be collection bins in the narthex labeled "MAKE A DIFFERENCE DAY COLD WEATHER DRIVE.*"
- 2. Repackaging coats after Make A Difference Day and distributing the coats to area schools.

We will be working with Serve Wenatchee Valley. They will collect and sort coats on 10/23. The GLC Youth will be sorting the coats into bags to take to the schools. The Social Concerns Team will deliver the coats to the appropriate schools.

### **Christmas Gift Cards for WHS Students**

The Social Concerns Team will be collecting Gift Cards for the homeless students at Wenatchee High School for Christmas this year. Tags will be put on a Christmas Tree in the church foyer. There are 280 tags on the tree. Each tag lists a place of business where you can purchase the gift card and the amount of the gift card. You then can bring the gift cards back to the church and place it in a box labeled "WHS Homeless Gift cards." We hope to have a WHS T-shirt, along with the gift cards purchased for seventy students. # **COUNCIL CORNER**

- 1. Congregational Meeting was September 26 after the 10:30 service. It was live-streamed on Facebook. There is one nomination for each open position of council.
- 2. The council will be working with Dr Stu Freed to develop standard decision-making processes, establishing communication pathways, and move forward with visioning for GLC.
- 3. Council approved the hiring of Sean Burns for the temporary Holiday Music Hire, November 1 through December 24, 2021.
- 4. Council reviewed and approved the Grace Lutheran Members-in-Need Policy and Application, with minor clarifications and format changes.
- 5. Council approved the hiring of Dane Breslin as a part-time Wenatchee Valley intern through GLC for 2021-2022

### **Endowment Team Distributions**

Since the Endowment Fund was established in 2000, Grace Lutheran has been able to donate \$263,974 to God's work within our church, the NCW community, and around the world.

The Endowment Team is pleased to be able to make this report to the congregation this year after being inactive during 2020. On short notice, we were able to gather several applications and fund 10 of them, all but one being local. Our shortened process, due to COVID, involved a detailed review and thoughtful allocation by the Endowment Team, bypassing the congregational input we have used in the past. In order to keep things equitable & even per request, we actually bumped up the distribution amount to \$60,000. We thank each of the applicants for taking the time to make a fund request. To honor & recognize each project, may God use our grants to further these very worthy & deserving causes.

### **CONGREGATIONAL MEETING**

**Treasurer's Report** 

September, 2021 Gwen Sparks, Treasurer

I am presenting the financial statement for the eight months ending August, 2021. Below are highlights.

**<u>2021 General Operating Expense by Ministry</u>** compares GLC approved 2021 budget to actual 2021 performance. Below table reflects: Total receipts are down, but likewise expenses were less than anticipated. Net deficit income for the eight months is (\$38,851). I have also included 8/31/20 financial numbers for comparison.

GLC was able to participate in the SBA Payroll Protection Program. Total amount was \$56,244 with funds used to stabilize staffing compensation. Because GLC has not received forgiveness at this time from the Payment Protection Program, the amount has been manually included below.

Internal Ministry Funds Report - Significant other activities include:

Social Concerns. To date, Social Concerns Team has funded \$60,407 towards various projects.

Memorial Accounts. Fox Trust current balance is \$2,737,703. GLC has graciously accepted new memorial funds totaling \$4,784. To date, Fox Trust funded \$70,000 towards the lighting project in sanctuary. Total cost of the lighting project is anticipated to be approximately \$80,000.

Special Projects. There is \$26,674 left to be funded for the 2020 Special Projects - \$3,500 update nursery and \$23,000 purchase church van. 2021 Special Projects was \$25,000. Activity is: 1) \$1,596 for computer upgrades, and \$2000 food pantry; 2) \$2,000 for youth room and playground upgrades of which \$1,023 has been funded; and 3) Available monies \$19,403.

<u>Miscellaneous.</u> Audit Committee has begun to review financial records. 2022 Operating budget procedures will begin soon. God continues to bless GLC. GLC in turn has blessed others through our missions. Please feel free to contact me with any suggestions/concerns.
