SCHOLARSHIPS UPDATE

Judging for this year's scholarship awards was done on February 13. At our February meeting, Rita Molepske, our Scholarships Chair, gave a report. Many thanks to Rita and the judges! Rita's summary follows:

The scholarship committee of 10 members judged the District 214 student art on Tuesday, February 13, 2024. We have a First Place Scholarship winner (\$1,500 award) from Prospect High School, a Second Place Scholarship winner (\$1,000 award) from Rolling Meadows High School, and a Third Place Scholarship winner (\$750) from Elk Grove High School. Awards (including our scholarship certificates) will be presented to the students at the Arts Unlimited Ceremony on Wednesday, April 3, Forest View, 4-6 pm. The Scholarship Awards are sent to each winner's school of higher learning after they are officially registered in early summer.

ART GUILD 03/21/2024 MEETING MINUTES Wheeling Township Building

Marion Sherman, **President:** Opened the meeting approximately 7:15 pm. Welcomed all attendees and discussed the need for one or possibly two volunteers to take charge of finding and securing galleries and public places to display and/or sell guild member's art work. Interested volunteers are encouraged to speak with Marion or any Board member about the Exhibition Chairperson position. The Banner Contest (for the Art Guild Tent at our August art fair) will be open to all Guild members except those who volunteer to be judges. Contest details will be forthcoming at the April Guild meeting and it's Newsletter. Currently, we know that all colors and designs for a banner displaying the words "Arlington Heights Art Guild" will be considered, and that the member's banner design that is chosen will be rewarded.

<u>Janet Grochocinski</u>, **Treasurer**: Our checking account balance last month was \$8,536.36. Incoming was \$3,015.00. Expenditures were \$1,577.41. Our current checking account balance is \$9,973.95. In our savings account we have \$1,556.73. In our CD's we have \$5,609.36. This leaves us with a grand total of \$17,140.04.

Patti Jostes, Membership Chair: Welcomed 5 guests and a new member, April Antonson, with applause.

<u>Rita Molepske</u>, **Scholarship Chair:** Showed us photos of the three District 214 High School scholarship winner's art work. The 1st place winner (\$1500) attends Mount Prospect High School, the 2nd place winner (\$1000) attends Rolling Meadows High School and the 3rd place winner (\$750) attends Elk Grove High School. Winners will be awarded Certificates of Achievement by our Guild at the "Arts Unlimited Gallery" in Arlington Heights on April 3rd.

<u>Larry Freson</u>, **Art Fair Chair:** Our annual A Walk in the Park art fair is set for August 25th. 47 paid vendors have already sent in applications. We have 3 food vendors. Larry introduced the Guild member, Lee Ann Kuhn, who volunteered to be our Coordinator of the Art Guild Tent. Two clipboards were sent around to all meeting attendees: one clipboard for any member wanting to display/sell their art in the Guild Tent, and one clipboard for members who will volunteer one hour of their time helping in the Guild Tent. Thank you Lee Ann.

Larry stated that he needs one more Guild member to take over the position of Volunteer Coordinator for the Walk in the Park. Kathy Stenger had the position and had to step down.

<u>Eileen Fogell</u>, **Program & Publicity Chair:** Introduced Sandra Sheagren, oil painting demo artist for tonight's meeting. Sandra is a member of the Glenview Art League as well as the Portrait Society of America. The meeting ended at approximately 8:55 pm.
