Henry H. Huson Park is located on Collins St. and contains 2.4 acres. Serving as a passive recreation facility, this park has bench seating adjacent to the recreation trail which runs from northeast to south west following the Mullet River. A foot bridge crosses over to the downtown area. Within the park area is a steeply wooded hillside along the river.

Stayer Junior Park is a 2 acre park located in the downtown business district. The park has frontage along the Mullet River and is fenced in with playground equipment and sitting areas. Mix historic behind the scenes buildings with the natural beauty of the riverside. Look down to the river and an array of interesting downtown buildings from the parking ramp at the Mill Street Transfer building or from the view from the Henry H. Huson Park perched high above. The railroad bridge crossing the river below with a winding walkway located behind 52 Stafford.

Ellwood H. May Environmental Park, 3615 Mueller Rd., Sheboygan. (See website at: [www.gomaywood.org](http://www.gomaywood.org).) NOTE: the Nature Center building will only be open on Saturday with bathroom facilities.

Park at nature center where you'll also find restroom facilities.

Maywood provides access to the Pigeon River, ponds and wetland areas, all within the 135-acre park. An outdoor deck (and windows) on the nature center provide an overlook of the Pigeon River.

Be sure to invite all people to learn about what we do. Be prepared; wear your lanyard and have pamphlets and your business cards handy. We are advocates for preservation.

Bring a lunch and gather at the deck of the nature center for critique and fun conversation at noon.

The park is easy to find.

It is best to visit the website and google directions. The location is in Sheboygan, take Hwy 42 east off of 43. Then turn right on Mueller Rd.
