Let's remember that elective abortion is different than those that happen naturally (like a miscarriage or where a mother's life is threatened for medical reasons). Killing without just cause has always been wrong (Gen. 9:6; Exo. 20:13; Matt. 5:21-22; Gal. 5:19-21; Rev. 21:8). A child conceived in rape or incest is not less human. A person's value is not determined by the circumstances of his/her conception (Gen. 1:26-27). Rape and incest are wrong. Period. We must all agree on this. But we must all agree too that the wrong of rape or incest does not justify the wrong of abortion (Isa. 5:20).

Keeping in mind that the child in the womb is a person, there is a very real sense in which that person is also a victim. When abortion is considered, the victim of rape is now taking out her pain and anger over the crime on the innocent child. Abortion will not erase the memory of what happened. It will simply make that child a victim twice: first from the manner in which he/she was conceived and the second in having his/her life terminated. The child becomes the innocent victim of two separate transgressions.

We are not saying that these are easy situations. They are not. These are life-altering tragedies. But we cannot become the monster we condemn. We cannot descend to murder because another injustice was committed. In this, we are trying to advocate for both victims.

Perhaps we should pause here and talk more about the role of the church. It is easy to condemn darkness without lighting a candle. We must do both. We simply cannot speak against abortion without offering alternatives. Education is important but what are we willing to do as God's representatives to dissuade abortion. What solutions are we offering? James wrote, "Pure and undefiled religion before God and the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their trouble, and to keep oneself unspotted from the world" (Jas. 1:27). James calls us not simply to avoid evil but also to practice righteousness. How often do the Scriptures call for God's people to protect the innocent? Are we not called to defend the defenseless? Jesus valued the lives of children (Matt. 19:14), and that should be reflected in both our advocacy and our actions. Could some among us offer adoption as an option? Could we plead that there is an alternative to murder and that the church of Christ is offering it? As the church, we need to be clear that we are for all life. We want people to know that the child is loved regardless of how he/she was conceived. We also want mothers to know they are loved too, regardless of how they got pregnant. The church must be better at presenting both the goodness and severity of God. Our Maker is against murder and is also forgiving and loving and gracious.

3. We also want people to know that two wrongs do **not make a right.** There are times when pregnancies occur as the result of violence, like in cases of rape or incest. These are tragic situations that leave the victims scarred for life—emotionally, physically, psychologically and socially. Perpetrators of these crimes should be punished harshly (Rom. 13:1-6), though they often are not. But it raises the question of what to do with the baby. The pregnancy was forced on the victim and some argue this justifies the abortion of the child. Would an abortion in this circumstance be Biblical? Should Christians accept that these are justified exceptions to elective abortions? The answer is no to both.
