I have told you before about my experiences in the military including my fall from the grace of God. That might sound dramatic, but it is true. I was not just hanging on by a thread. I was in every way gone from God. I stopped praying. I was not associated with the church. I did not read my Bible. I did not care. I was a part of the world and I questioned everything I had been taught to the point I was somewhat agnostic. So, when I "came to myself," like the prodigal son (Luke 15:17), I had to start at ground zero. I was not just polishing off an existing faith that had gotten a little dusty from non-use. I was starting from scratch. This is why I can say my understanding of the church is different now than it was then. This is why I can say my faith is different now than it was then. It took being apart from God for me to realize how desperate life is without Him. My faith is my own now. My ideas and conclusions from Scriptures are my own now. My investigations were without bias and preconception. I set all that aside. I wanted to go wherever the truth would take me. And that journey from nothing led me right back to the church of Christ. I am saying now for the world to hear I love the church of Christ. You should too. And I want us to consider some reasons we ought to love the church of Christ.

1. My first reason is that the church of Christ is Biblical. When I started my search for the truth, I pledged that I would have the courage to go wherever the evidence led me—even if I ended up as something different than my parents religiously. I did not have to read the manuals of every religious group in the world to know what was right. I only needed to study the Bible carefully to find my way to the right church. For many that might sound like a pompous remark, but it really is not. If we accept the fact of God's existence (Psa. 19:1), and that God created the world (Gen. 1-2; Exo. 20:11), and that the Bible is His inspired word (2 Tim. 3:16-17), then it would be contrary to His orderliness, His nature and authority to believe every religious group in the world meets with His approval. Even starting out where I was, I could see the inherent contradiction of more than one body of believers. It just did not make sense that Jesus would die and offer a plan of redemption only for people to serve Him in thousands upon thousands of contradicting religious bodies. The Bible is very plain that God "is not the author of confusion but of peace" (1 Cor. 14:33). If Jesus promised only to build one church (Matt. 16:13-19) then there was a way for me to know which one was right. I knew based on His promise that it would not even come down to a few "best of the best." There would literally be one church that met the criteria. There would be one body of people identifiable by the standards of Scripture. This is the church of Christ. And this is why I love the church of Christ.
