upside down and often financially ruined. I hate that treatments are sometimes worse on the body than the disease itself. I could go on, but you understand my point. I'm guessing you feel the same way.

I know that hate is a strong word, but we are told to "hate every false way" (Psa. 119:104). Cancer is ultimately one of the terrible consequences brought into the world because of sin. When Eve and Adam partook of the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil, it changed everything. All of the struggle and pain and stress that God wanted to keep from us became part of our world when the devil gained advantage over the first man and woman. Though we are not guilty of the sin of Adam and Eve personally, we are subject to the effects of their sin (Rom. 5:12). Cancer is just one of them. That is why we hate it.

Physically speaking, there's hardly a scarier word from a doctor. But our view isn't limited just to the flesh. In fact, Paul tells us to look beyond our present struggles and consider grander things. "For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, is working for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory, while we do not look at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen. For the things which are seen are temporary, but the things which are not seen are eternal" (2 Cor. 4:17-18). So as much as we all hate cancer, we rejoice in the things that cancer cannot do:

- Cancer cannot destroy our spirit, love for life or our sense of humor.
- Cancer cannot steal our love and compassion for others.
- Cancer cannot take away our friends.
- Cancer cannot destroy our relationship with God.
- Cancer cannot cause God to love us less.
- Cancer cannot take away our hope.
- Cancer cannot destroy our faith.
- Cancer cannot stop us from serving or worshiping God.

I've spent many a sleepless night over the years, struggling with the news that people I love have been diagnosed with cancer. I know you have too. But if we look beyond the flesh and consider all of God's promises, it will help us through.
