This is particularly important in this age, since many seem lost as to which principles take priority over others. That doesn't mean any are unimportant. It only means that truths work when the foundation for those truths is in place. Consider, for example, how Jesus explained the same when debating the Pharisees just before His death. "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you pay tithe of mint and anise and cummin, and have neglected the weightier matters of the law: justice and mercy and faith. These you ought to have done, without leaving the others undone" (Matt. 23:23). Our Lord wasn't calling for the exclusion of the tithes especially since He said not to leave them undone. But tithing was valueless if it stood alone. It only had meaning when filtered through justice, mercy and faithfulness. So there is a sense in which we could say, "first things first." If we get the foundational principles right, then everything else should fall in place behind.

There is much talk lately about what makes for a good society. Are nations better off if they focus solely on economics? Should the emphasis of a nation be almost exclusively foreign policy? Or are there principles that run deeper that should be considered first? In the words of Jesus, are there principles that should be considered up front without leaving the others undone? If my claim is to be a Christian, then I am professing the reign of Jesus over my heart. I am saying that my life is crucified with Christ (Gal. 2:20). I am saying that all of my thoughts are being submitted to my Savior (2 Cor. 10:3-6). This also means I must do as He did and honor those principles established by God to yield, "very good" results (Gen. 1:31). As we read through the initial chapters in Genesis, here are some foundational principles that should stay on our "first things first" list:

- 1. The sanctity of human life (Gen. 1:26-28).
- 2. The sanctity of marriage and the home (Gen. 2:18-25; 1:26-28).
- 3. Human beings are created for fellowship with God and sin destroys fellowship (Gen. 3:1-15).
- 4. We must respect authority and understand our accountability (Gen. 2:16-17).
- 5. God intends for people to possess individual freedom (Gen. 2:16-17).
- 6. God's redemptive plan is the defining emphasis of history (Gen. 1:15).
- 7. God is loving and gracious (Gen. 2:7, 9; 3:15).

What good is an economic policy to a nation that does not first consider God or value human life? What good is a foreign policy to a nation that fosters sinfulness and lack of respect to authority? How do we work on social structures and programs in a nation if we don't first understand divine redemption? Our concerns must never be refined to a single-issue, but they should be prioritized. If we don't, then no matter what we do as a nation, we are bound to hear Jesus say, "from the beginning it was not so." Let's respect those foundational principles that shape our interactions with the world. First things first.
