Thankfully, people saw their way out of such an iniquitous view of God. He is certainly angry with sin but patient with the sinner (2 Pet. 3:9). He does not rejoice when we are injured or down. He even declared it. "For I have no pleasure in the death of one who dies" (Ezek. 18:32; 33:11). God is happy with our success. He desires the best for us in every way. He is not gleeful in our suffering.

Our view of others should reflect our heavenly Father's. Sadly, it often does not. As much as we denounce the Edward's approach to the divine nature, we sometimes adopt it in the way we view and speak of others—specifically when our opponents suffer misfortune. Have you seen a little of that lately? Have we been personally guilty of that? Are we gloating over the suffering of others? Are we gleeful when we see harm and ruin come to people with whom we disagree? Do we laugh when our enemies struggle? Do we chuckle when they trip in life? I understand that loving and praying for our enemies is a tough thing to do. We all struggle with it. But let us all understand, we are wrong to rejoice in the misfortune of others. If we complain about the "angry God" presented by Edwards, then we cannot be guilty of the same.

The Bible teaches us to avoid this behavior. "If I have rejoiced at the destruction of him who hated me, or lifted myself up when evil found him...indeed I have not allowed my mouth to sin by asking for a curse on his soul" (Job 31:29-30). "Do not rejoice when your enemy falls, and do not let your heart be glad when he stumbles" (Prov. 24:17). "He who is glad at calamity will not go unpunished" (Prov. 17:5). "But you should not have gazed on the day of your brother in the day of his captivity; nor should you have rejoiced over the children of Judah in the day of distress" (Obadiah 1:12). "Rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep" (Rom. 12:15).

It is easy to be bitter when we feel injured and just as easy to rejoice when those we hold responsible for our stress fall in a pit. But we must remember that God is not gleeful in our suffering. If God doesn't, we should not gloat and laugh either. Let us exercise compassion toward all people, even those with whom we disagree.


