.....They only talk to neighbors and friends about Jesus in the building. They only participate when in the building. Being isolated for some months away from the building has been largely detrimental for a great number of this belief. With no access to the building, their faith has been stunted. For the rest, this has been a reality check about what real discipleship entails. There is no question that a building is an authorized expedient. We are required to assemble and be together in our worship (1 Cor. 11:23-34; Heb. 10:24-25). A common place of meeting is just a good idea for a number of reasons. If we've learned one thing this year, however, it is that Christianity occurs in more places than just the building. We've been brought back to the fact that Christianity is a lifestyle that extends to every aspect and moment of our life. Away from the building, we still have neighbors and friends lost in sin. Away from the building, we still need relationships with our brethren. Away from the building, we still give glory to God.

If we had been listening, we would have been working on this all along. Paul said, "Therefore, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God" (1 Cor. 10:31). Though he writes this in a context about exercising opinions, there is a principle established that Christianity is a full-time profession. In our discussion, Paul is telling us that we must give glory to God whether we are in the church building or not. No matter where we are and no matter what we are doing, our goal must be to glorify our Savior. Christianity is not something we turn on and off at the doors of the building. Christianity is who we are.

This means our goal is to glorify God, in the ways He prescribes, everywhere and in all things. When I am driving to work in the morning I can give glory to God. When I am talking with friends on the phone I can give glory to God. When I am planning my schedule and balancing my budget I can give glory to God. When I am making TV selections at night I can give glory to God. When I am posting on social media I can give glory to God. And so on. See how that works?

Please don't take this the wrong way and think the central meeting place isn't important. As a congregation, our building is the place designated for us to be at certain times in the week (Heb. 13:17). We should be there. If I can go to restaurants, grocery stores and other places, then I can certainly assemble for the much greater purpose of worship. But all of us were faced with the reality this year of what to do when we are not in the building. The answer is what it always has been: glorify God. My prayer is that we have all learned this year the important truth that Christianity continues in spite of setbacks. We find the path at every crossroad in life that gives glory to God and then we take it.
