The elders have made the decision to bring the congregation back into a single worship service. This is different than what we have been experiencing since early June. To this point, our congregation is divided into two groups. This limits the number of people in the building at one time and allows social distancing. Though we gain something in the divided services we are also losing something. No matter which service you attend, you are still worshipping God in spirit and truth. We are all exploring the same material in the sermons. However, half the congregation is missing. Friends are missing. We aren't seeing half of our family. They're worshipping too; they're just not here when you are.

The elders know that this can only be a temporary arrangement. God never meant for His people to be divided and alone. His plan is for togetherness. After all, the church is a "called out assembly." We aren't the church unless we are an assembling people. Paul told the Christians in Corinth, "when you come together to eat, wait for one another" (1 Cor. 11:33). He was referring to the Lord's Supper but the rebuke was for their habit of dividing the assembly. From this we can draw the principle that God wants the whole church together. Temporary setbacks are expected and allowable. Our God is patient and merciful. But we entered this knowing these split services were going to end. Looking at our numbers over the last few weeks and the space in the auditorium, the elders feel we can move to one service. Praise God!

This does not mean that we are throwing caution to the wind. This does not mean we are going to be careless with our health. There is a balance the elders are seeking between the physical and the spiritual and they need our help with that. Here are two things they need from us:

1. First and foremost we need to be praying. Pray for the elders as they lead us (1 Thess. 5:12-13). Pray that God will watch over and protect us, spiritually and physically. Pray that our faith and trust in God will grow through these unique times.

2. Let us honor what the elders have been asking of us physically. Prior to our meetings in June, the elders published a letter outlining a path for safely reassembling during the Coronavirus. As much as we want to hug and touch each other, our effort toward a single service can only work if we honor distancing-standards. This is obviously not what we want as many of us are dying for a handshake and a hug. But distance between people is the only way we will be able to come back to a single service—at least until things change in a more positive direction. Please refer back to the letter or ask for another copy to review the additional recommendations.

There is a lot being debated over the virus and that means many voices and many opinions. The eldership is doing the best it can to lead us through these uncharted waters. Their burden is unimaginable. What is not debatable is our need for each other. We need to assemble. Let us pray for wisdom and safety as we move forward.
