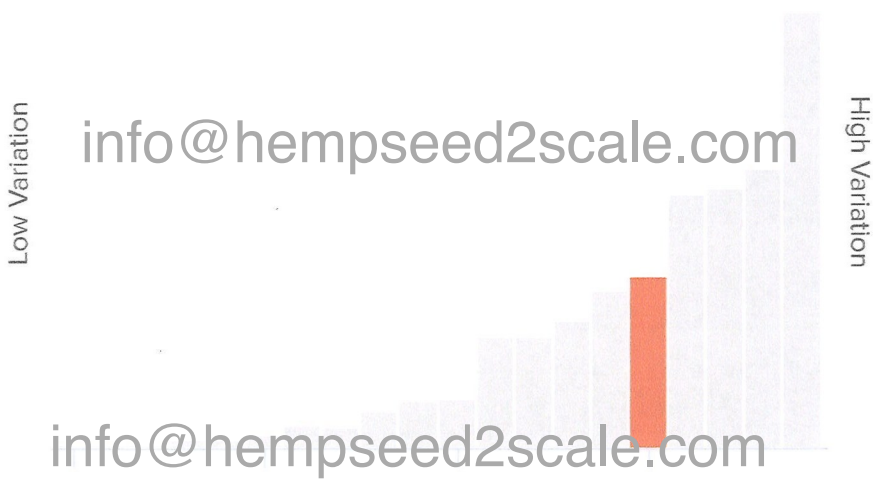


Genetic Variation

Cherrie Ultra has a moderate level of genetic variation indicated by the orange bar.

The barplot shows the frequency of all varieties in the Phyllos Galaxy grouped by levels of genetic variation. A low level of genetic variation (homozygous) indicates a stabilized or true breeding line that will produce offspring with consistent physical characteristics (phenotypes); varieties with higher levels of genetic variation (heterozygous) are not true-breeding, and will produce offspring with very different physical characteristics.
