#### Of Life: Martin Pressgrove

Martin Ross Pressgrove, Jr., 77, passed away
Friday, Aug. 28, 2020 at his home surrounded by his family.
Martin was born December 7, 1942 in Glendale,
CA., the son of Martin Ross Pressgrove, Sr. and Margaret
Armista (Beal) Pressgrove. The family moved throughout
the west and midwest during his childhood, settling in
Tecumseh, KS where he graduated from Highland Park
High School in 1960. Following graduation, he studied at
the University of Kansas and Baker University and went on
to graduate with an elementary education degree in 1967.

He proudly served our country in the United States Navy in 1967, serving a nearly two-year deployment in Vietnam on the U.S.S. Fletcher DD 445 and followed up his active service with more than 20 years of service in the Navy Reserves.

Martin was united in marriage to Barbara Boyd on Aug. 8, 1970 at the First United Methodist Church in Baldwin City as part of a double wedding with Barbara's brother, Dr. Roger Boyd and his wife, Jan. The couples celebrated their Golden Anniversaries of 50 years of loving marriage earlier this month.

He began his teaching career with the fifth and sixth grade in Hiawatha, KS, in 1969 and retired as a paraprofessional at Baldwin High School in 2009. His career as an educator was not limited to the classroom. He was also a Scoutmaster for over ten years with the local Boy Scout Pack 65 and was always involved in his own children's activities.

Martin was a member of Baldwin First United Methodist Church, where for several years he served as the church custodian. He was a member of Lions Clubs International. He also held the role of Secretary with American Legion Lloyd Beaton Post 228.

A man of many talents and passions, Martin liked to read and could be found working on his VW Vanagon or his Subaru. He enjoyed birdwatching and the great outdoors; so much so that any piece of litter he encountered, anytime and anywhere, would be disposed of properly. He loved kids and for almost twenty years he ran a sno-cone stand as a hobby at the Maple Leaf Festival and other festivals in NE KS.

Martin was preceded in death by his parents, Martin, Sr. and Margaret; a sister, Carolyn Wilson; and a brother, Daniel Pressgrove.

#### **Worship Attendance Reminders**

- We will ask that you pre-register for worship, but of course, we will also have a process to welcome those who join us on Sunday morning without pre-registering.
- Household units will be seated together, and distanced no less than 6ft from other household units.
- For mutual protection, masks will be required, hand sanitizer will be widely available, and good hygiene practices will be encouraged.
- We ask that you show love and care for one another through non-contact greetings.
- You are encouraged to dress for comfort, as some windows will be kept open for ventilation.
- You will notice other changes in the sanctuary. Pew cushions have been removed for more efficient cleaning. Song books, pew bibles and attendance pads have also been removed to reduce contact points.
- All those who are physically able to use the front entrance (up the outdoor stairs) are asked to enter this way. We will provide a "drop-off" area along Grove Street for those who need it. We ask that you leave the lower level entrance for only those who need to use the elevator. This will maintain a more uniform flow of traffic and make social distancing easier.
- When you arrive: If you pre-registered, a greeter will confirm your attendance. If you did not pre-register, the greeter will gather contact information. Whether or not you have pre-registered, you will be asked to confirm that your household is symptom free and without known contact with a

- positive/suspected case of COVID-19. An usher will then help you find your seats.
- Offering plates will be positioned at the doorway of the sanctuary, and electronic giving information will be available on the screen.
- Services will be short, approximately half an hour and will not include congregational singing. However, music will continue to be part of how we worship.
- Communion will continue to use elements prepared for each household. Masks may be briefly removed to consume communion. We will continue to make elements available for at-home worshippers upon request.
- Children will ALWAYS be welcome at BFUMC, and we trust that parents will make wise decisions about their children's ability to abide by social distance guidelines and masking for those over 2 years of age. We will have Wikki-stix (moldable wax coated yarn sticks) available for any children present, and after use, the sticks may be taken home or thrown away. These will replace our pew bags. We will not have children's church or children's time, but efforts will be made to offer ways for every generation to be engaged in our worship.

Bathrooms will be closed, but not locked. Use of them is discouraged, but available in an emergency. Please practice good hand washing if they are used.





#### **New District** Superintendent

In a heartfelt ceremony online service, three new district superintendents were installed during a virtual gathering on Aug. 16.

The Rev. Dr. Tom Brady was installed as Five Rivers and Parsons districts superintendent; along with two other newly appointed superintendents to their areas: the Rev. Jenny Collins for the Topeka and Flint Hills districts; and the Rev. Dee Williamston formally added the Hutchinson District to her duties as Salina District

"This is a historical moment for the Great Plains," Bishop Ruben Saenz Jr. said at the beginning of the 60minute ceremony, noting it was the first time that multiple districts were celebrated together, with an online service.
