It can be tempting, sometimes, when we look back at the lives of those who have led the way for us, to transform them into heroes. We might even be tempted to skip over the parts of their stories that remind us they were also humans and sinners. But that is a huge mistake. Part of the beauty of All Saints is not just remembering the incredible faith and deeds of those who came before us, but even more importantly, reflecting on God's pattern of goodness and transformation. When we can see in the lives of those who came before us their full humanity, as they say, "warts and all" we can better see God's goodness at work.

We can be reminded that God does not wait to use us until we have it all together. God does not look for perfect people to be leaders. God does not need us to be infallible. God wants to use us, as we are. Right Now.

When we recognize this good news, I think it makes us braver. Not only does it give us courage to see how God might be calling us to lead in our own circles of influence, but it gives us courage to make changes. When we make those who came before us heroes, we feel as though we must preserve the way they "did" church. When we allow them to be humans who engaged with and served God in the ways that best fit their time, needs and circumstance, we are freed to do the same, even when it means making changes to the way we've always done things.

Let us not be lured into believing we face a binary choice between honoring our history and adapting for the future. Let us instead be awed by the God of Both/And. The one who was with our ancestors, and who is faithful now, and who will be with our children's children. Thanks be to God!!!

Baldwin First is offering free Covid Testing here at the church. Our church has impacted the lives of many community members and multi-generational families near and far for over 150 years. From worship, to Sunday School, to choir, Institute, Youth Group, UMW, UMM, to memorable life events such as baptisms, confirmations, marriages and memorial services. Our beautiful historic church is facing needs of new repairs (a boiler replacement) and the need for an upgrade of audio/visual equipment to support virtual streaming services for those who cannot attend worship, meetings, and bible studies as we try to meet the both/and worshipper's needs.

Opening

Nancy called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m.

Minutes

Doug moved and Linda seconded the motion to approve the minutes of July's meeting. The motion carried.

Finances

Finances are in a position to be able to move forward with the capital campaign. Colleen will be utilizing on-line banking so that finances can be viewed in 'real time.'

Caregivers

Linda's group of caregivers will meet on September 1st if the facility is open. She also shared concerns on behalf of several congregants and friends.

Missions

Laura shared that the missions committee helped to welcome Baker students. The food pantry continues to be a drivethru venue. Laura asked the Council to determine how they would like to

proceed with the food pantry and fundraiser during Maple Leaf. Nancy asked for input from the Council. Kathleen reinforced the idea of offering walking tacos. Tara suggested leaving the restrooms open and offered the idea of sharing a gift of hospitality. Pastor Amanda asked that the sanctuary be open. Doug proposed that we lean towards hospitality rather than selling food. It was decided that we might postpone making a decision for a few weeks to see the trend of the virus.

UMW

Donna said there will be a meeting in September and thinks there may be an outdoor activity in conjunction with Ives Chapel.

SPPRC

Staff appreciation will occur in September, October, and November. The committee will be developing a new job description for the administrative assistant position.

Worship

Kathleen addressed the need for volunteers for children's time during service. Brad announced Blast Crew will be reconvening after Labor Day, and offered their services on occasion.

Trustees

Darren shared the status of the boiler; it has been ordered, and should be installed in the next several weeks. The congregation approved the application for a loan of \$60,000 for repairs and

innovations. There was discussion of locking the kitchen. Laura suggested that when we dedicate the new kitchen, we invite people to make donations of the items we would like to see replaced. A

preliminary date is set for November 7 at 8:30 a.m. Darren asked for suggestions regarding winter care of sidewalks.

Lay Position

Marvé is in her second year of the certified lay program. She has recently served at nearly 15 churches, covering for pastors who have not been able to take vacation. She asked for permission to continue her studies. Doug moved and Kathleen seconded the motion to support Marvé in continuation of her work. The committee agreed to the proposal.

Pastor's Moment

The loan application has been approved and is ready to be mailed. Pastor Amanda is settling into her role in dual churches, and recognizes that Ives would like to confer regarding holidays and sharing of resources. There may also be options to consider for 5th Sundays.

Pastor Amanda offered a closing prayer at 8:21 p.m.
