Waiting in the tension.

I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in his word I hope. -Psalm 130:5

Lent is a time of tension. A time when, in worship, we confess our sins and long to hear words of pardon. A time when we commit to showing up for God in new and focused ways through prayer or fasting or works of mercy, and yet often become more aware of our inability to will ourselves closer to God.

In 2019, in the United Methodist Church, we are also walking a path of great tension in the denomination. We are waiting in tension to see what of the plans passed at General Conference will survive Judicial Council. We wait in tension to see how Bishops, Annual Conferences, Local Churches and clergy will respond to tightened definitions and heightened punishments. We wait in tension to see if our global connections will hold. We wait in tension to see how our relationships within our local church will hold.

And then comes Holy Week. A reminder that the people of God have known tension before. A reminder that the uncertainty is not new. The weariness is not new. The fear and anxiety are not new. We long for a way out, to fast forward through this part:

Through the heightened emotions of a last holiday meal together;

through the dark sorrow of a prayer vigil;

through the arrest, and trial, and torture of our beloved Lord:

through the dark noon-hour of Good Friday;

through the helpless waiting of Saturday.

But we cannot. This is how our God chooses to love us, to enter with us into those darkest, hardest, saddest, most anxiety riddled hours, to bear with us the unbearable waiting of Saturday, to descend even into death.

So that....

There is no dark corner of our lives or of our world untouched by redemption. There is no place the light of resurrection, for which we wait, cannot reach.

And so we wait, and even in the darkness... we hope. This is the tension and the beauty of Lent and Holy Week.

So May It Be.
