Neighboring as Discipleship

My earliest childhood memories were formed in an idyllic little neighborhood. It was a dead end street in Ashdown AR. It was a dead end because it backed up to a federally protected preserve of some kind. It seemed, to a very young me, that my mother knew everyone on our street. I can remember going with her to a neighbor's house a few times a week when that neighbor had a new (and very colicky baby). If the baby was sleeping, my mom and the neighbor would have coffee or tea or a Pepsi and chat. If the baby was awake (it was probably crying) my mom would "take a turn" She would coo and sing and bounce and sway and when the baby would relax (and usually fall asleep) reassurances would follow that it wasn't that she was "better at babies" but that we get into tension cycles with our own children. Other times it was dropping off a casserole or fresh baked bread to a neighbor who'd been ill, or the many neighbors that tag teamed to get my sister and me to school during the month long saga of chicken pox rolling through our home.

So- imagine my surprise that as an adult, I found it so hard to be that kind of neighbor. I knew that a friend across the country had fried Oreos at the local street fair, but didn't know the name of my next door neighbor. When my friends and colleague Adam Barlow Thompson started a non-profit dedicated to promoting better neighboring, I was intrigued.

What really took me by surprise though, was when I found that the changes I needed to make to be a better neighbor, were also the changes I longed to make to be a better disciple of Jesus Christ.

I needed to stop thinking in terms of scarcity of time, energy and resources, and start to think in terms of abundance of skills and creativity and community.

I needed to switch from a mind set of fierce independence (some of us are rather slow the "me-do-it" of toddlerhood, and adopt instead a mind set of strength in interdependence.

I needed to spend less time and mental energy in shame, guilt and resentment, and find restoration in the spiritual discipline of joy and celebration.

These are the changes of perspective we'll be exploring in our September worship series on the Key Ingredients of Neighboring and Discipleship.

\*\*The Great Plains Conference of the United Methodist Church highly recommends that all individuals working with children and youth complete a boundary awareness training called Safe Gatherings. This is an online training accessed through the conference website. <a href="https://www.greatplainsumc.org/safegatherings">https://www.greatplainsumc.org/safegatherings</a>. The church conference conducts a criminal background check on those completing the Safe Gatherings training. The cost of the training is \$36 (for the background check) and the church will cover this cost. Baldwin FUMC makes every effort that individuals working with children and youth are Safe Gatherings certified (certification is good for 4 years). We appreciate our ministry volunteers being willing to complete this training so that we can ensure the safety of our children, youth, and leaders, as well.
