As I see it...



Good intentions are the starting point of every journey, but the destination depends on the choices we make along the way. The weather has not been favorable for us and so we have kept postponing the start of Men's Bible Study Karen kgroup and nowlitis the Lenten seasonke Fabi project. For now, let us focus on Lent and then project later, we will revisit the Men's Bible study

group.

A joint traditional Ash Wednesday service will be held at Baldwin First UMC on March 5th at 7 pm. Ashes will distributed from 6:30-9:00 am in front of the church. Ash Wednesday is one of the most popular and important holy days in the liturgical calendar of the UMC. It is a special day that opens Lent, a season of fasting and prayer.

The season of Lent takes place 46 days before Easter Sunday. For us at Baldwin First, and Ives Chapel, we are going to observe the season and have a Lenten Study by Adam Hamilton's book, "Final Words From The Cross." This will also be the theme for the Lent season. We will study the book for six weeks as a group or 46 days as an individual. The Bible Study at Baldwin First will start on Sunday March 9 at 6:30 pm and finish on April 13. For Ives Chapel, the Bible Study will be at 1:30 pm on Wednesdays beginning March 12.

"In life and in death, Jesus' words were powerful and meaningful. Despite the serious effort and increased pain required for Jesus to speak as he hung on the cross, Jesus spoke seven 'final words': "Father Forgive Them", "Today You Will Be with Me in Paradise", "Behold Your Son. Behold Your Mother", "My God My God, Why Have You Forsaken Me?", "I Thirst", "It Is Finished Investment Your Hands I. Commit My Spirit."

On Maundy Thursday, we will witness an Upper Room play at 6 pm at Baldwin First Fellowship Hall. Maundy Thursday holds great significance for Christians. Maundy Thursday commemorates the Last Supper, marking the foundational event of Jesus sharing his final meal with his disciples before his crucifixion. Because of this understanding, following the play in the Fellowship Hall, we will have a fish fry for supper. Donna Curran will give us more details on the meal.

On Good Friday, April 18, we will have a joint evening service at lves Chapel at 7 pm. Good Friday is a day in which we can reflect upon the goodness of God. We invite you to take part in our Good Friday service as we remember God's love for us, and also invite you take part in all that He has to offer us through His sacrifice and invitation to the communion table.

To close the Lenten season, we will have a joint <u>Resurrection</u> <u>Sunday</u> morning service at Baldwin City Golf Course on April 20th at 7 am. Baldwin First will have service at 9:30 am.

The following is the synopsis of the book study:

Have a happy Lent! Pastor Ezekiel



Lent begins on <u>Ash Wednesday</u> and ends at sundown on Holy Saturday, the evening before Easter. The English word "Lent" comes from the Anglo–Saxon word lenten, which means "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of "Spring."



During Lent, we enter into a season of preparation, self-reflection, and repentance when we seek to literally "turn around" and realign our lives and focus toward God. It is a time to give up things as well as take on new life-giving practices, helping us rid ourselves of distractions and our own selfish desires. By doing so, we seek to live and love as more faithful disciples of Jesus Christ.

We celebrate the good news that in Christ's death and resurrection we, and all creation, are continually being made new by God's love and saving grace.



"Fat Tuesday" in the context of the United Methodist Church refers to the day before Ash Wednesday where Christians traditionally celebrate with a large meal before the Lenten season of fasting begins, hence the term "fat" signifying a day of indulgence before a period of abstinence; it is essentially a celebration of rich food and festivities before the penitential season of Lent. This event is sponsored by UMW.



There will be two service options for Ash Wednesday on March 5: (1) Meet us on the front lawn of the church from 6:30-9:00 am for imposition of ashes, or (2) a traditional Ash Wednesday service will be held at 7 pm.

Ash Wednesday emphasizes two themes: our sinfulness before God and our human mortality. It helps us to realize that both have been triumphed through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.
