As I see it...



Happy new year! The old is gone, the new has come. What is your New Year resolution? It's a great time to think about the New Year's resolutions as we begin the year 2025. It can be nervewracking when you are uncertain of what lies ahead.

There is a story about a happy little boy who went out into the field wearing a baseball cap. In one hand he carried a baseball, and in the other hand, his trusty



bat. His face bore a look of tremendous confidence. Cocking his bat, he tossed the ball into the air, saying, "I'm the greatest batter in the world!" Then he swung and missed. "Strike one," he said. He picked up the ball, examined it, and then threw it into the air again. As he swung, he repeated, "I'm the greatest batter in the world." Once again he missed. "Strike two," he said. This time, he stopped to examine his bat to make sure there wasn't a hole in it. Then he picked up the ball, adjusted his cap, and tossed the ball into the air for the third time. He repeated again, "I'm the greatest batter in the world," and swung with all his might -- and missed for the third straight time. Now most boys might be discouraged by that, but this boy said, "Wow! I'm the greatest pitcher in the world!" As we anticipate the next 12 months, some people might eagerly look forward to what each day will bring.

Others might be filled with dread, worried that this year will be worse than the last. Like the little boy with his baseball bat, I would suggest that our attitude will make all the difference in the coming year. How we react to its event will largely determine whether it is a year of victory or a year of defeat.

The Apostle Paul was never one to let circumstances conquer him. Rather, with the help of God, he was determined to win the victor's crown. I would encourage you to read Philippians 3:12-13 (ESV), "Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. [13] Brothers and sisters, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead".

Paul's personality and attitude, I believe, really comes through in these verses. As we embark on the journeys of this New Year, let us determine ahead of time that it will be a year of victory! Let us choose our own attitudes and follow the advice of the Apostle Paul.


O Little Town of Baldwin Living Nativity




