## Soup Dinner / Living Nativity


Baldwin First has two events on Saturday, December 7 during the Festival of Lights.

# **Pastor Ezekiel's Mission Trip**

Pastor sent a few pictures showing him working on water purification containers in Kenya. He has been working with Cheptuech Africa Gospel Church members fitting purification kits to water containers so that the elderly people in the village can have drinkable water. There are many waterborne diseases in the villages because people fetch water from creeks and drink it with no purification. As a result, they find themselves with disease such as h.pylori, cholera, schistosomiasis, dysentery, and typhoid. It has killed mostly the elderly people because their immunity is very weak. Pastor Ezekiel felt called to teach them how to purify water before they drink it.

We look forward to more details of his strip when he returns this week and pray for his safe return home!

God, born in Bethlehem this night, for me and for the world.




