Opening: Nancy called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. Minutes Doug moved to accept the minutes from January. Brad seconded the motion; the motion carried. **Finances:** Brad addressed payments of major expenses. The running checking account looks positive at this time.

SPPRC: Cat is recovering from surgery. Information for "The Vine" can be shared with Samantha. **Caregivers:** Linda shared that approximately 225 sets of the Teeny Tears items have been donated. **Missions:** Lenten materials should be arriving via mail. Vouchers and bags of food items are being given out at the food pantry. Requests will go out for laundry detergent for the Lenten season. We can expect to see information regarding refugee relief in the coming days.

Worship: "Ashes on the go" will take place Wednesday from 7 a.m.-1 p.m. Kathleen is recruiting volunteers. Holy week will have a variety of activities including a palm parade. Although there will be virtual service on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday will be observed. Easter will begin with a sunrise service at 7:00 a.m. at Sullivan Square. Ives Chapel will host a breakfast at 8:00. Regular services will follow. Communion will be offered at both services.

United Women of Faith (UMW): The Spring meeting will be April 30th at 9:30. The ladies plan to fill 15 purses with necessary items. Future meetings will be held 3-4 times annually rather than monthly.

VBS "Being Fed in the Word of God" will be the theme of a VBS Food Truck Party held on July 17-21 from 6-8 p.m. Donna is getting her crew together; volunteers are welcome.

Lay Leader: Doug will offer a state of the church address on Sunday, March 6th. In April, he will attend a meeting on the one-board-model.

Trustees: Darren shared that the boiler is installed and is working well. Other improvements will be necessary for the system to function perfectly. Nancy asked about a plan for ice and snow removal, including sharing information so those interested in helping can be informed. There was a meeting with MSM and the electrician regarding audio-visual equipment. They are awaiting final numbers on additional lighting and electrical expenses.

Pastor's Moment: Pastor Amanda will be contacting Wesleyan Investive for a final update. **Council Chair:** There are ample Covid tests to offer additional dates to serve the community. We will need to determine when and how we would like to relax our mask mandates. Backup procedures for emergency worship are being established by the worship committee.

Closing: Pastor Amanda offered a closing prayer at 7:58.

Meanings of the Backdrop for Lent (continued from last month's newsletter

In continuation of the symbolic meanings through the rest of the season of Lent, Baldwin First is displaying visual aids on a table in the sanctuary(added weekly and explained during children's time at each Sunday of Lent).

On Sunday, April 3 rd, the fifth Sunday of Lent, A basin and ewer represent the act of Pilate as he washed his hands of the guilt of condemnation for himself and place it on the people.

The following Sunday, April 10, is Palm Sunday representing Jesus 'victorious entry into Jerusalem, palm branches were strewn and waved in front of Him with shouts of Hosannas.

April 14 or 15 (Maundy Thursday/Good Friday) a chalice, awns of wheat of bread and grapes indicate the symbols of the Last Supper. The twelve grapes symbolize the fruit that lasts, not only of the first disciples as well as for all the saints who live with Jesus down through the ages.

Volunteers: a heartfelt **THANK YOU!** You are not only beneficial to our church for the delivery of services and daily operations but it is a joy to witness your servant's heart! Approximately 63 million Americans, 25% of the adult population, volunteer their time, talents, treasure (and testimony in the case of a church venue) to make a difference. The highest volunteer rate is found in religious organizations (34.1%) with food collection or distribution (24.2%) the uppermost activity. By the way, the average hourly wage for a volunteer in the United States is \$18.71.
