Growing up in a large (loud) family, I was a college student the first time I ever lived alone.

Learning to live with the quiet of evenings and weekends was a struggle. Sometimes, I would overfill my schedule so that I didn't have time to be alone until I was so tired I could quickly fall asleep. Eventually, though, this plan fell apart, and I found another way to cope. I discovered food network. Rachel Rae, Emeril Lagasse and Alton Brown became the standard background noise that got me through the long hours of doing homework or cleaning my dorm room by myself. I struggled with the silence again in seminary, when a spiritual disciplines professor challenged us to begin each of 10 days of intensive course work with a time of contemplative prayer in silence. I didn't find the silence centering. I suddenly became fixated on the sound of the ticking clock, how loudly my stomach just rumbled.

Then, when James was born, I discovered the sacredness of silence. He was only a few days old when I received word that a friend's father was dying. The late night feedings, sitting in the dark and quiet hours, holding the warm tiny bundle of my new baby, became a holy vigil. I thought of my friend at her father's bedside, caring for him tenderly in his final days, and I felt connected to her and to God in the depth of this quiet.

Silence is still not my first impulse to connect with God. This is probably good since silence is rare in a home with three elementary age boys, but when I find those moments of quiet, I have stopped trying to find a way to fill them. Instead, I have come to remember Elijah in 1 Kings (19:11-13), who, in the midst of his most troubling time of feeling spiritually distant from God, found God not in the awe and wonder of the earthquake or the fire or the lightning, but in a still small voice in the silence of a cave.

In this time of isolation, you may find you have an over-abundance of silence. Or, like me, you may be starved for a little peace in quiet in the bedlam of having everyone home. Either way, I encourage you to lean in and listen for God's still small voice. The one that says "Fear not, for I am with you." The one that reminds you that "You are beloved." The one that fills you with eternal hope.

And may it strengthen you to be agents of God's love and mercy, as it did for Elijah.
