# Baldwin First United Methodist Church September 27, 2021

**Opening** Nancy called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. Minutes Brad moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting, and Tara seconded the motion. The motion carried.

**Finances** Brad shared that we have been approved for the \$60,000 loan. Final documents will be forthcoming. The committee will develop a checklist to ensure that tithes and gifts are kept secure. General checking still looks positive, and budget discussions for 2022 are underway. Ives Chapel has expressed a desire to engage in a discussion regarding contributions to the parsonage upkeep.

Caregivers Caregivers will next meet on October 6th in Fellowship Hall.

Missions Laura stated that there will be no fundraising or food distributions at Maple Leaf. There may be an opportunity for individuals to hand out water or be available in the building. Baldwin First will be serving as a Covid test site 6 days a week. This service will be made available in conjunction with the food pantry on Saturdays. A vaccination date may become a possibility as well.

SPPRC Tara shared that there is a virtual mental health first aid course free to the congregation on October 9th. DCCCA is forming partnerships with faith communities to help promote heathy habits and safe choices among young people. BLAST Crew and Missions will pursue the conversation.

Cat Use of personal devices is becoming excessive. She will be making information available to finance and trustee committees in hopes of a solution.

Trustees Darren reported on the boiler; it should be delivered shortly.

**Pastor's Moment** Signage will indicate that masks need to be worn in the building, and Covid tests will need to be taken outside of the building. Stakes are available as signs are ready for use. Worship series has a few more weeks of a mini-series of the past, present, and future of the church during the weeks surrounding Maple Leaf.

**Council Chair** Nancy shared that the capital campaign is underway. The committee has been designated and letters will go out to congregants next week. In excess of \$21,000 has been donated in advance of the official beginning of the campaign. Nancy asked for input concerning hiring a consultant. The consensus was to utilize the expertise within the committee for the time being. Pastor Amanda offered a closing prayer, and Nancy closed the meeting at 8:23.


# **Most Current Financial Update:**

**FOOD PANTRY** THE PANTRY IS IN NEED OF FUNDS to continue this very important outreach. We thank all who support the pantry with their time, prayers, and gifts.

**HALLOWEEN and UNICEF** This year UNICEF is raising funds to combat COVID worldwide. UNICEF is working to help deliver 1.4 billion COVID-19 vaccination doses around the world – along with masks, hygiene supplies, treatment, and diagnostic kits. \$1.80 purchases 2 liters of hand soap; \$37 purchases 2 does of COVID -19 vaccinations for 10 people; \$100 purchases 325 face masks
