- Hospitality/Fellowship Team: Greeting, ushering, or helping with events (Talk to Katherine Cook).
- **Missions**: Participating at food pantry, visiting the sick, or helping with local/global missions (Talk to Susan Butell or Nancy Arnold).
- **Prayer and Care Ministries:** Supporting others through prayer, counseling, or practical help in times of need (Talk to Pastor Ezekiel or Linda Ballinger).
- **Facilities and Maintenance:** Maintaining the outer yard, and keeping church building clean, safe, and welcoming (Talk to Mike Curran).

Each act of service, no matter how small, is valuable in the eyes of God.

Barriers to Serving:

It's normal to feel hesitant. You may think:

"I'm too busy."

"I'm not qualified."

"Someone else can do it better."

But God doesn't call the equipped—He equips the called. If you have a willing heart, He will give you strength, wisdom, and opportunity. Start small. Talk to lay leader (Doug Cheek) about areas of need. You might be surprised how your gifts align perfectly with what's needed. I have included an informational flyer for your review. Last year we had about 85 people of all ages join together in service, and so we look forward to providing this opportunity again at BFUMC, with your approval.



Thank you, Kelly, for sharing your talents to benefit our community!







