# **President's Message**

#### Aquarius 2025 is about to begin!

The reception for the Aquarius Show will be held from 2:00–4:00 on Sunday, February 23, 2025, at Art Center Morro Bay. Keiko Tanabe who is the Juror and Judge for the show will be there to give a gallery talk regarding the strength of the pieces that were selected. Awards will be announced at 2:30.

This year we have increased the award amounts. The first place award is \$800, second place is \$600, and the Judges award is \$500. There are several other cash and merchandise awards that will be presented as well as recognition of our new signature member. A Signature Member is a person who has had their work accepted into three Aquarius shows.

Did you submit one or two paintings and not get in the show?
Don't be disappointed or feel like it is time for you to stop painting. Remember the Juror for the show is only one person and this one person does not have the last word on what is "art" and

what isn't. While Keiko is a very talented artist in her own right, she is not the "be all to end all". The job of the Juror is to curate the show. Each show will have a variety of paintings, and it could be that several artists already submitted a painting similar to yours and we can only put one or two paintings with the same theme as yours in the show. Not being selected to be in the show doesn't mean you are not a successful artist.

What does it mean to be a successful artist? "Artists Network" recently posted an article entitled, "How Do You Define Success as an Artist?" In this article they quoted 17 noted watercolor artists. Not one of them was quoted as saying they felt successful when they got into a

#### **December 3 - Luda Bryan Demonstration- Painting Florals**

Liudmila (or Luda, as she is called) graciously stepped in at the last minute to fill in for Tracy Taylor. For this presentation, Luda showcased her step-by-step approach to bringing a rose to life on paper.



With the image drawn and the background painted around it, Luda began by defining the petals and leaves -

edges and textures. She uses only very transparent paints in order to capture the transluscent nature of the flower.

While we waited for this stage to dry (Luda never uses a dryer on her work), she talked

briefly about her background: she moved from Russia to the Central Coast 27 years ago; she met her husband (from Ukraine) in San Luis Obispo. A former dental assistant, Luda took up her watercolor brushes 10 years ago, concentrating her efforts on florals and animal portraits. Recently, she has begun experimenting with acrylic.

Continuing on to the final stage, Luda added another thin layer of paint, creating sharp edges of pink with touches of Dr. Ph. Martin's Bleed Proof White. Examining the completed rose, I was captivated by its translucence, its fragility, its perfection. Thank you, Luda, for your inspiration.

# January 28 - Aquarius 2025 Digital Presentation

Continuing a tradition of the past several years, January's meeting featured a digital slide show of ALL the Aguarius 2025 entries, not just the ones that have been accepted into the exhibition. Sixtyseven artists from all over the state submitted 111 paintings through EntryThingy, a digital software specifically for art exhibitions and competitions. For this show, our juror, Keiko Tanabe, selected fortytwo paintings, forty-two artists.

prefaced the slide show with a brief summary of the process of selection.

Step 2: applying

transparent color

Before sending the digital photos on to Keiko, Jeanie inspects each one to ensure it meets the criteria specified in the Prospectus. This year, only a few got it wrong!

Fortunately, EntryThingy automatically creates the slideshow for the juror. By the time of our January meeting, Keiko has already made her selections. For our benefit, last names were indicated on each of the 111 images we saw. Be assured that **Keiko** never sees the artists' names, only the titles and whatever description each artist includes on Entry-Thingy.

Following the presentation, most of us agreed that seeing the artwork in person allows for a deeper connection. Visiting the Aquarius show at Art Center Morro Bay is sure to offer an irreplaceable, multifaceted experience that's not just about viewing art but also about feeling it.

# How to Maximize Your [Workshop] Experience\*

- Lay aside any ego. Come with a humble attitude.
- Come prepared with the prescribed materials. Not having those materials available can cause frustration for you and the instructor.
- Take everything in: watch what's happening on the paper; look for the thickness of paint as well as the colors used.
- Practice, practice, and practice...repeatedly (and bring a sense of humor)!
- Have a desire to learn, to focus, and to try new things.
- Put aside unrealistic expectations. This is not a competition and you're not here to create a masterpiece.
- Embrace frustration. Your knowledge base is almost always going to outrun your painting ability. Flip it so that it becomes motivation.


