OCTOBER 2021 Monocr On Slow presented by CENTRAL COAST WATERCOLOR SOCIETY

Now that summer is almost behind us it is time to start changing our painting focus for the next season. Autumn, which is just around the corner, is my favorite season. Fall is a perfect time for all water media paintings. "Why?" you might ask. Let's look at two adjectives that are used with the autumnal season.

The first of these is the adjective "vivid." The meaning is bright-colored, brilliant, glowing strong, bold, flamboyant and eye-catching. The second is the word "kaleidoscopic" which means multicolored, many-hued, variegated, rainbow, or looking like an explosion of your paint supply. Both of these adjectives fit a watercolor palette like a glove.



The restart of CCWS's Monday Morning Painting group has created a positive change in my personal interest in painting. I must confess I did not touch a brush since being treated for pneumonia in March 2020. I now find my experience was duplicated by a significant number of fellow painters during the COVID-19 pandemic. Having attended the 4 paint-ins in July, I am personally experiencing a renewed, positive painting energy which has been shared by and with fellow attendees. This change has been so significant I wanted to explore why this is happening to so many Monday morning artists.

We all know that the COVID-19 pandemic created an economic crisis. It also has been reported that the psychological consequences of the pandemic have been catastrophic and include conditions such as generalized anxiety, mild to severe depression, insomnia, and a state of fear in communities nation-wide. Additionally, the actions of public health officials *required* to

combat the virus such as social distancing, masking, and closure of certain businesses contributed to the consequences. These necessary, but combative to some, actions can make us feel very isolated and lonely. They can also increase the levels of stress and anxiety with our members and the population in general.

More important to me personally and to our CCWS membership are studies which effectively argue that artistic creativity, and the process of making art, helps us to maintain our

emotional well-being. Active participation in artistic activities can also be important for sustaining interest in life. These types of activities comprise cognitive and physical processes that can be highly infused with personal emotions. By participating in these activities, an artist often finds purpose in their lives. This feeling of purpose by the individual will contribute to their subjective wellbeing while helping and being appreciated by others. This connection is particularly strong in the case of the COVID-19 outbreak because it has made human mortality incredibly salient to each of us. I hope all CCWS members can join their fellow artists to share in our joint artistic response by attending some of our Monday morning painting sessions. From my recent experience, I feel they will add to our ability to deal with the results of the pandemic.

- 2. Original work only
- 3. No size requirements
- 4. Entry by members only
- 5. CCWS members will judge the show
- Email the digital jpeg submission of your painting - and the name of your painting. You do not need to rename your jpeg identification.
- 7. Image should be cropped to show only the painting; no matting, background or frame allowed on the image.
- 8. Image must represent the painting exactly. No computer modifications please.

Must Be Vaccinated, and COVID Rules Apply



David J. Rogers Watercolor Workshop Paintings and Review by Signature Member, Mary Kopecky

During the past four months, I have enjoyed participating in David J. Rogers' live on-line Watercolor Mastery workshops. David is an accomplished local professional watercolor artist who has a Fine Art Gallery studio in Morro Bay. He patiently teaches a monthly

three-hour, on-line, interactive, step-by-step, watercolor workshop along with his wife and son (they field questions and provide technical assistance). The classes are typically held on the second Saturday of the month beginning at 10:00 am.

These paintings are from David's "Watercolor Mastery Workshop Series." The cost is a mere \$49 for three hours of valuable instruction. He offers tips and

techniques for the beginner as well as the advanced watercolor artist. Prior to the class he provides attendees with a download of a free technique video pertaining to each specific class as well as a complete materi-

als list, a traceable drawing, a colored photo of the finished reference watercolor painting, and additional downloads supportive of the subject matter (i.e., photo of the actual subject matter, bird anatomy for the bird class and anatomical references for the portrait class).

Following the class, each participant receives an edited replay of the entire workshop to allow artists to practice the lesson again or apply what was learned to their own subject matter. Students who belong to his free on-line 'Everything Watercolor Group' are encouraged to post their completed work on the site. The quality of the finished work is impressive even for beginning artists. This is an interactive zoom workshop, and you can type in ques-

tions that will be passed on to David to answer as he is teaching.

Tricia Reichert Demonstration Webinar Review The Power of the White Paper


In the sixth webinar sponsored by CCWS, Tricia led us through the benefits of saving the white paper in a painting and how powerful it can be when used as a design element.

Some great take-aways from the presentation were: the best type of white paint to use for different effects; a light middle tone next to white can make it look whiter as opposed to a dark color; and a white space always appears to be bigger than it actually is. Just the smallest amount of

white paper can be very powerful, especially in a mid-tone to dark subject.

Tricia also suggested many ways to achieve "white" in a painting. She says right up front that she is not a purist (using only watercolor) so she





The white of the paper can be reduced with a very light tone of color and still read as white, just not as harshly as shown in the photo at left. A very light wash of Raw Sienna was used.

Areas of white paper can be used as a light focal point accent or highlight with additional small light accents.

shapes like those on the boats, can be used to lead the eye around the painting.

doesn't have a problem using white gauche on top of the watercolor to recapture the white. Other ways to achieve white are with: salt, scraping, wax crayon resist, frisket, and lifting. And of course you can always paint around an area that you would like to be white.

Membership Renewal Information

CCWS board members have been getting questions about membership renewal and when fees need to be paid. Hopefully this will help answer all your questions.

CCWS Membership runs from Janurary 1st to December 31st each year. The year is paid for in advance, is due by January 1st and currently remains at \$30 per year.

Because of reduced member benefits in 2020 and 2021 due to COVID, all memberships were extended.

If you are a current active member of CCWS that paid dues in 2019 and 2020, your membership was extended through all of 2021 and will expire December 31st. You will need to renew your membership by Janurary 1, 2022. If you are a NEW or REJOINING member of CCWS that paid after December 1, 2020, your membership is paid through December 31, 2022 and will not be due again until Janurary 1st, 2023. (This is a small group, and you will receive an email from Jerry regarding your status.)

Current members entering the Aquarius 2022 Show may renew their membership by including it with their show entry fee.

New or rejoining members joining now and paying with an Aquarius entry fee will enjoy membership through December 31st, 2022 and your renewal date will be Janurary 1st, 2023.

According to CCWS Bylaws, your membership is deliquent and will be cancelled if you have not renewed by March 1st of the year you are paying for. Signature Status and DVD Library membership will be terminated as well if it applies to you.
