What we do



VETERINARY OUTREACH

Our teams of veterinary volunteers provide support in towns and cities across the North East, North West, Yorkshire, Wales and Northern Ireland. Our Vets will routinely provide: Nose to tail health checks, vaccinations, flea and worming treatments and microchips. We refer our patients to veterinary practices for treatments and procedures we cannot perform on the street, such a neutering. We fund treatments for all conditions diagnosed.

EMERGENCY KENNEL SPACE

The scheme supports homeless people who need to access NHS inpatient services or support, and to prevent rough sleeping where no accommodation is available which is pet friendly. Up to 14 days provision can be supported in some areas by referral.

DOG CHAMPIONS SCHEME

Street Paws Dog Champions Scheme was launched in 2019 to support accommodation providers to become pet friendly. We provide Staff Training and support, pet policies and full veterinary support. Street Paws can fund and install kennels onsite for those partners who, for a variety of reasons cannot allow pets inside.

Value of your donation

Putting on an event, such as a ball, sporting event, a pub quiz or a fun day, can raise a lot of money and awareness by getting many people as possible involved. You might even interest local media in what you're doing. To help you get started think through the following:



What will I do? Look for inspiration with our fundraising ideas.



Where will it be? Think about capacity, parking, transport, disabled access and cost.



Will it be indoors or outdoors? What will happen if the weather is bad? Will a venue donate their space?



And when? Check the date doesn't clash with anything else going on – big local events, major sporting events on the TV etc! Check that some key people are available so you know you'll be able to rely on their support.



Who will come and who will I involve? Use social media and local media to spread the word, and be clear as to whether public event or invite only



Where should I promote it? Think about Social Media/ local press



Do I need insurance or any permissions or licenses?

Sell tickets

It may seem obvious but charging an entrance fee to your event is going to be one of the main ways of making money. And if you make sure you allow people to buy tickets in advance, then you're guaranteeing donations even if they don't end up being able to come on the day.

Get sponsorship

You could ask your workplace or other local businesses if they would be interested in sponsoring the event. They could give a donation and in return you could put their logo on a programme or auction brochure, or invite them to have their banners at the event.

Raffles or auctions

These are a great, fun way to get people involved and give more on the day without feeling like they're donating extra money. Source some raffle prizes that you know will have a wide appeal to your audience. Selling raffle tickets only at the event rather than beforehand means you don't need any licensing in place so it's much simpler to do

TRADITIONAL FUNDRASISING IDEAS



Get sponsored to run, cycle or swim Sponsored head shave Family fun day bake it!

Sweepstakes – whether it's who's going to win Love Island or the FA cup, this is such an easy way to raise cash!

Supermarket bag pack or collection

GIVE SOMETHING UP



Get sponsored to give up something you are known to be lost without, or something you know that is bad for you, or just something you really enjoy!

Dry January – or any month of the year you can handle!

Coffee – get sponsored to give up your morning cup, you could also donate the money you save! Your smartphone – is it always glued to your hand with you constantly checking for updates?

Smoking – come on, you know it's bad for you anyway!

Shaving - see how long a beard you can grow!

Whether you tie in with existing activities that regularly take place or organise your own thing, get people involved!
