7. <u>Public Comment:</u> 940 Cottage Street, Ishpeming and 950 Cottage Street, Ishpeming talked about the blight issue in North Lake. They stated there is garbage, junk, vehicles not licensed, and garbage bags at many residents. They are sick and tired of this. They pay taxes and want to be treated the same as everyone else on the South side. They believe the Township is not following the Ordinances and not fining residents and wanting the Township to enforce the Ordinance. <u>Treasurer Thornton</u> stated that the

previous Police Officer Kohler was active in North Lake and the Township has new Officers that have been transitioning into their positions. <u>Supervisor Nankervis</u> stated the Township know has 2 new Police Officers and will have them respond to the complaints.

Susan Hill, 1720 North Lake Drive, Ishpeming, Fred Anderson, 1715 North Lake Drive, Ishpeming and Travis Allen, 1745 North Lake Drive, Ishpeming complained about their neighbor Cody Weinberg at 1705 North Lake Drive, Ishpeming. He has threatened them. He is carrying a knife or a hatchet saying he will chop off their fingers, will kill them, spits at them telling them and he hopes they gets AIDS, He is playing extremely loud music and putting it in the window towards the Anderson's house, and is screaming and throwing rocks. Ms. Hill stated he attacked Mr. Allen and asked if the Township will re-visit the ordinance. They would be sincerely happy. Mr. Anderson stated there is a pending stalking charge against him. He has started calling 911 and has sent videos to the Township Officer and Sheriff Department 7 times in 2 weeks. He used to see kids going to the ice cream shop all the time and no kids go there because of him. Mr. Allen stated Cody circles around his house, and he has to be outside with his kid. Something needs to be done and doesn't know what. He would like the Township to take a look at the business the grandparents are running out of their house, ABC Embroidery. Supervisor Nankervis said he will turn it over to the Township Police and will re-visit a Noise Ordinance that the Township is not taking this lightly. Treasurer Thornton stated Township will look into an Ordinance but it may be bigger issue than an Ordinance.

Mike Nardi, 175 Four Corner Drive, Clark Gravedoni, 650 County Road GGG, Pete Heikkila, 660 County Road GGG, Cindy and Paul Heino 1140 County Road GGG, and Rich Tyynismaa, 273 Four Corners Drive all of Ishpeming Township attended the meeting to discuss their request to remove County Road GGG from its current status as a "seasonal road". Below are statements made by the residents. They said there are 10 families that now live out there. The road is terrible and is tearing up vehicles. The County will not plow or push back snow banks and the nearest street light is 1 mile away. They are worried emergency vehicles would not make it out there, and pot holes are bad. Mr. Heikkila stated he submitted a letter to the County and that they have added 2 culverts. He said Govern Whitmer declared a state of emergency as a disaster. Mr. Gravedoni asked to put in gravel to bring up the road. It takes 15 minutes to go 1 mile. The County will not let the residents work on it, unless they have a permit. Mr. Heino stated he would call the County to have them push back the snowbanks but they do not come out anymore. Mrs. Heino asked what are the 1st steps they should take to resolve this problem. Supervisor Nankervis stated that the Township has put over \$150,000 into that road. He has a call into Ross Olsen at the Marquette County Road Commission to discuss. The paved roads in the Townships subdivision were paid by the resident. County Road GGG was a 2 track road. We are waiting to hear from the MCRC. The consensus is there are 3 bad parts on the road that

everyone would like fixed; gravel would work, and then gradually work on the road in the future. They will have one spokesperson, Mike Nardi for the Township to contact to communicate with and provide updates
