

SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation: Confessions are usually heard on Saturdays from 4:15 PM - 5:00 PM in the Reconciliation Room at the Church, or at other times by appointment. Communal Services are scheduled during Advent and Lent.

Eucharistic Adoration: Usually 12:30 to 4pm on Thursdays.

Baptisms: Important information can be found on our website at www.catholicwb.org/sacraments as to how to get started. Baptisms for children are scheduled no more than 2 months in advance. Adults interested in becoming Catholic should inquire about the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

Anointing: Persons concerned about their health are encouraged to receive the Sacrament of the Sick.

Marriage: Our wedding guidelines document which contains key information can be found at www.catholicwb.org/sacraments. Couples planning marriage are asked to contact the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to their proposed wedding date.

Confirmation: Adults seeking Confirmation should call the Parish Office. Young people are usually confirmed in the 10th grade after two years of preparation.

Next weekend, there will be a second collection for the Priests' Welfare & Retirement Fund. Please give generously to this special collection. The Diocese assesses us over \$40,000 annually to help retired priests working in our Diocese, and your donations help reduce the amount we would otherwise have to take from our general operating funds. (This collection is different than the one for Retired Religious. That is a *national* collection to assist religious orders. This is for priests in the Diocese of Raleigh.)

Your contributions in these second collections help fund the Clergy Pension Plan; medical expenses not covered by insurance; long-term care & nursing home costs; as well as salary, benefits and living expenses for priests who are not retired - but who are too ill to be in active ministry. (For example, the late Fr. Joseph Vetter, the late Msgr. Matthew Hendrick and Fr. Gene Grabowski all benefited from this fund.)

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The wonderful diversity of life and worship among Roman Catholics of East and West is an example of God writing straight with crooked lines. The steady hand of the villainous Emperor Diocletian drew a line across Europe and Africa that split the empire in two, and for the most part determined how Christians would worship two thousand years later.

Italy's heel and the far northern city of Trieste fell on the Eastern side, and have had a form of Eastern liturgy ever since. Constantinople, which soon became the seat of the Roman Empire, became a base for Christianizing the East up to Russia and Poland. Poland was on the Eastern side, but a series of wars and medieval mayhem pushed the religious boundary back to the Ukraine, and Poland remains an outpost of the Latin Church to this day.

An old rule of thumb declared that whatever religion was observed by the local prince, the people had to follow. This gave rise to persecution and migration as people sought toleration for their expressions of faith. In the United States, we are accustomed to peaceful collaboration among Christians of East and West, a situation that challenges churches that still feel the pinch of age-old division.

Parking - when attending Mass

Thanks for remembering....

- 1) Not to park in such a way that your car blocks other parking spots - preventing them from being used. Every parking space is incredibly valuable - particularly during the three weekend Masses.
- 2) To exit the parking lot as soon as reasonably possible -particularly if your car is blocking someone else's.

Also...

3) There is NO overnight parking in our parking lots at any time (whether you display a yellow parking hangtag or not). If you leave your car overnight, you will be towed.

4) If you are using your yellow hangtag for beach parking on Saturday, you must vacate the lot by 3:30pm. There is no beach parking during weekend Mass times. Of note, "facilities" are typically only available during parish scheduled events, so please plan accordingly.


