

#### **REVELATION OF GOD'S PRESENCE**

Today's first reading from Isaiah arises out of the ordeal of the people of Jerusalem and Judea as they anticipate the end of seventy years of exile in Babylon. Their sufferings and their oppression will end, and they are promised joy like that of a great wedding upon returning to their homeland. Although this passage is probably set in the early sixth century B.C., it is free of historical particulars. Accordingly, the Church has understood its imagery universally, as it proclaims God's promise of healing, hope, and happiness for all peoples, in this world and in the next. When read against this background, the story of Jesus' turning water into wine at the wedding at Cana becomes a revelation of God's presence in the person of Jesus, making these promises real for us in the here and now, in the transformation of our own lives.

#### **SACRAMENTS**

**Reconciliation:** Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4:15 PM - 4:45PM in the Reconciliation Room at the Church, and other times by appointment. Communal Services are typically scheduled during Advent and Lent. **Eucharistic Adoration:** Thursday 12:30PM - 5:30PM

**Baptisms:** Important information can be found on our website at <a href="https://www.catholicwb.org/sacraments">www.catholicwb.org/sacraments</a> as to how to get started. Baptisms for children are scheduled no more than 2 months in advance. Adults interested in becoming Catholic should inquire about the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

**Anointing:** Persons concerned about their health are encouraged to receive the Sacrament of the Sick. (Hospital & nursing home patients should notify the Registration Department, the social worker, or Pastoral Care upon check-in.) **Marriage:** Couples planning marriage are asked to contact the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to their proposed wedding date.

**Confirmation:** Adults seeking Confirmation should call the Parish Office. **Faith Formation, Confirmation, First Communion:** Classes have begun.

## Pardon Our Dust.....

Please be careful in the parking lots and when walking around the property and inside the church.

The HVAC system is in the process of being replaced and there are workers, materials, trucks, etc., around at various times.

The new system is designed to not only improve temperature regulation, but also to provide a less noisy, better acoustical experience within the space. In addition, the air exchange will be greater (healthier for those inside) and the humidity will be more tightly controlled.

We thank you, the parishioners, for your continued support of St. Therese parish, thus allowing us to do this major improvement, which will ultimately reduce our maintenance costs in the long-run.

Meanwhile: Please also be tolerant of *temperature fluctuations* over the next few months during the installation of the new system and the dismantling of the old one. (Dress in layers.)
