#### **RESUMPTION OF DAILY AND WEEKEND MASSES (LIMITED ATTENDENCE)**

Fr. Trent and the St. Therese staff are pleased that Daily and Weekend Masses have resumed (but with COVID-19 restrictions.) These Masses have very LIMITED attendance at our uniquely small location at Wrightsville Beach, and require on-line sign up via EventBrite in order to attend. (Please print your ticket and carry it to Mass.) As such, the following guidelines should be carefully reviewed:

Masses are **NOT** open to the public. You must have signed-up via EventBrite (emailed invitations will be sent via Constant Contact) and be a **current, registered parishioner** in order to attend.

There will be no congregating in the church before or after Mass. (No confession. Attendee will park and proceed directly to pew and be seated – maintaining Social Distance of at least six feet.)

We ask that all attendees be masked.

We ask all attendees to carry hand sanitizer for personal use.

No restroom facilities will be available.

Entry and Exit to the church occurs through one door only.

During Mass There is no congregational singing. (Hymnals are removed.) Place any collection envelopes in designated basket upon entry/exit. The Sign of the Peace is modified.

During Communion, remain in your pew until a spot is available. (The ushers designate.)

Communion is distributed the hand only. (Recipient should have washed or sanitized hands prior.)

Recreational parkers must exit at least one hour prior to daily Mass time and two hours prior to weekend Masses.

There is no access to any other buildings on the St. Therese campus, at this time, including the Parish Hall.

At the conclusion of Mass, we ask that you proceed directly to your vehicle and exit the lot.

Rules and guidelines are subject to change rapidly based upon guidance we receive from the Diocese, and government entities.

Daily Masses are available (21 attendees only) and weekend Masses (31 attendees only) .

Any public contact presumes a health risk during this time.

#### You should NOT sign up to attend a Mass in person if:

You have a fever, or are sneezing, coughing, or unwell in any way.

You have health conditions which would make you more susceptible to becoming ill.

You require frequent restroom use. (The restroom is NOT available.)

You don't have a face-mask or hand sanitizer.

You fall into one of CDC risk categories.

#### SAINT KATERI TEKAKWITHA (1656-1680)

Though the New York State Thruway runs close by the North American Martyrs' Shrine, traffic's roar never pierces the peace enveloping Auriesville—Ossernon to Native Americans—in the lovely Mohawk Valley, where Kateri Tekakwitha was born barely ten years after the martyrdom of Isaac Jogues and his Jesuit and lay companions. Daughter of a Christian Algonquin mother and non-Christian Mohawk chief, Kateri's parents died in a smallpox epidemic widely blamed on the missionaries. Moreover, many Native Americans had experienced exploitation at the hands of "Christian" traders and trappers, further discrediting the faith Kateri embraced in baptism, then pledged to live even more intensely in vowed virginity. Misunderstanding led to harassment, prompting her move to a Christian village farther north along the Saint Lawrence River. Despite this, Kateri's faith remained undaunted, her selfless charity undiminished. Both before and after her death at twenty-four, this young "Lily of the Mohawks" drew countless converts to Christ by the fragrance of her goodness. Through us, does "the aroma of Christ" (2 Corinthians 2:15), attract others to the beauty of his gospel?
