#### IT'S ALL ABOUT CONTROL

From toddlerhood to old age, we grow in mastery of our own lives, our bodies, and our destiny. This mastery is hard won, and we don't let go of autonomy easily. Much of this self-mastery involves the avoidance of pain or discomfort, so when we hear things like "take up your cross" and "lose your life," we tend to resist the message. James says that faith without works is dead. Ouch! That is really a direct message! One way to look at this, as well as the part about losing our life to find it, is that faith is a process of more and more openness to God's direction of our lives. It is very hard for us to give up control, but perhaps what we are being asked to do is not to become passive and babyish, but to allow God to direct where our self-mastery will lead and what it will accomplish. We are asked to relinquish the need to control the results of our efforts; to risk, as Jesus did, the loss of everything we are working to achieve. We are asked to let God take the lead and to control the results, even though we may never see those results.

#### **SACRAMENTS**

**Reconciliation:** Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4:15 PM - 4:45PM in the Reconciliation Room at the Church, and other times by appointment. Communal Services are typically scheduled during Advent and Lent.

**Eucharistic Adoration:** Thursday 12:30PM - 5:30PM

**Baptisms:** Important information can be found on our website at <a href="https://www.catholicwb.org/sacraments">www.catholicwb.org/sacraments</a> as to how to get started. Baptisms for children are scheduled no more than 2 months in advance. Adults interested in becoming Catholic should inquire about the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

**Anointing:** Persons concerned about their health are encouraged to receive the Sacrament of the Sick. (Hospital & nursing home patients should notify the Registration Department, the social worker, or Pastoral Care upon check-in.) **Marriage:** Couples planning marriage are asked to contact the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to their proposed wedding date.

**Confirmation:** Adults seeking Confirmation should call the Parish Office. Young people are usually confirmed in the 10th grade after preparation.

## Priests' Welfare & Retirement Collection - Last Weekend!

**Thank you** for your generous donations to this special collection over Labor Day weekend which further reduced the amount we will otherwise have to take from general operating funds to cover this obligation (which is assessed at over \$40,000 annually.)

This is different from the special collection early in December to support Retired Religious. That is a national collection to assist religious orders. This collection is for priests working in our Diocese. (The late, Msgr. Matthew Hendrick, Fr. Gene Grabowski, the late Fr. Trent Watts, and the late Fr. Joe Vetter have all benefited from this fund.)

#### **Some Numbers**

- \* **70** the normal retirement age for priests in the Diocese of Raleigh
- \* **\$3,043/month** the current benefit paid to retired priests of the Diocese of Raleigh who have served 20 years or more
- \* **50%** portion of the assessment that funds the Diocese of Raleigh Clergy Pension Plan.
- \* **19%** portion that pays long-term nursing home costs for priests of the Diocese of Raleigh and to pay salary, benefits and living expenses for priests of the Diocese of Raleigh who are not retired but currently not able to be active in ministry.
- \* **13%** portion the Diocese of Raleigh provides to Religious Orders of priest (Franciscans, Jesuits, etc.) working in the Diocese of Raleigh to assist with their retirement (\$4,600 to the Order for each priest assigned here).
- \* **8%** portion that funds medical expenses of priests working or retired in the Diocese of Raleigh that are not covered by insurance (after priests have paid \$500 deductible).
- \* **8%** portion that funds health insurance and Medicare premiums for retired priests of the Diocese of Raleigh.
- \* **2%** portion that funds the Clergy Care Management Program which provides acute health intervention and wellness programs for priests of the Diocese of Raleigh.
- \* **1%** portion that funds legal, actuarial and other professional services to maintain the Clergy Pension Plan of the Diocese of Raleigh.

## **Offering and Intercessions**

In this holy moment—with the consecrated bread and wine, the Body and Blood of Christ, upon the altar—we pray for a share in the fruits of Christ's sacrifice. We offer to God what God has given to us, and we intercede for the Church and the world. We pray for the pope and for all the bishops, and we mention the bishop of our local church by name. We pray for the clergy and for all the people of God. We pray in a special way for those who have died. And we pray for ourselves, that one day, with Mary and all the saints, we may come to that place where Jesus already reigns. These prayers of intercession, like the General Intercessions earlier in the Mass, broaden our focus and remind us that the Eucharist is offered not just for those gathered, but for the salvation of the entire world. The Eucharistic Prayer leads us from an intense focus on Christ, present in the consecrated host in the hands of the priest, to a loving sweep of prayer that embraces the world.
