Wrapping up the 2nd annual Mo Ag Stewardship Conference

The Stewardship Conference was held on January 26 at Concordia Community Center. Our group welcomed speakers Phil Needham, David Kleinschmidt and Drexel Atkisson. Phil shared insights on maximizing wheat yields, as well as optimal planter set up for successful planting. David spoke on the intricacies of soil health and how it relates to crop inputs. Drexel shared a demonstration called the Slake test and also spoke on warm season, native grasses and their benefits in a grazing system.
