

What's in bloom in the ELIZABETHAN GARDENS



The Elizabethan Gardens is a 10.5 acre public garden located within Fort Raleigh National Historic Site.

The Gardens contain over 500 different species of plants. Featured collections include hydrangeas, camellias, historic herbs and a wide variety of native coastal species. Five full-time gardeners and several seasonal and part-time assistants care for The Gardens. Flower displays are changed seasonally to insure colorful displays throughout the year.

Abelmoschus, Anemone tomentosa (Grape-leaf Anemone), Ruellia brittonia (Mexican Petunia), Salvias, Lobelia cardinalis, Lantana, Pink Bush Clover, Hedychiums (Ginger Lilies), Encore Azaleas, Rudbeckia laciniata (Cutleaf Coneflower), Abelmoschus (Silk Flower), Pentas, Begonias, Impatiens, Dicliptera (Hummingbird Plant), Canna Lilies, Chrysanthemums, Torenia, Chrysanthemums, Angel's Trumpet, Vitex.

OCTOBER

Azalea x 'Conlee' (Autumn Ruby Azalea), Salvia coccinea (Peach Nymph Salvia), Salvia 'Cherry Chief', Salvia guaranitica (Blue Brazilian Sage), Salvia elegans (Pineapple Sage), Salvia leucantha (Mexican Bush Sage), Salvia 'Honey Melon', Salvia 'Anthony Parker', Salvia 'Indigo Spires', Salvia madrensis (Forsythia Sage), Salvia 'Purple Majesty', Salvia 'Mystic Spires', Brougmansia (Angel's Trumpet), Lantana, Rudbeckia laciniata (Cutleaf Coneflower), Ruellia brittonia (Mexican Petunia), "Encore" Azaleas, Osmanthus 'Gulf Tide', Osmathus heterophyllus, Eleagnus pungens (Russian Olive), Canna Lilies, Solidagos (Goldenrods), Farfugiums (Leopard Plants) – spotted, variegated, green, Tricyrtis hirta (Toad Lilies), Anemone (white one next to gatehouse), Pentas, Begonias, Impatiens, Double Rose Impatiens, Roses, Hedychiums (Ginger Lilies), Chrysanthemums, Bear Claw (Stinking) Hellebore.
