CAPEX 2022 in Toronto this past week was a huge success. It's just what the doctor ordered! The world's first One-Frame Exhibition had over 400 entries!. The quality of the exhibits was outstanding. (CAPEX 2022 Palmares page 18). The talks and workshops were plentiful and offered every philatelist something. Graham Beck gave a very interesting and engaging talk on "Extreme Stamping" (page 17). The bourse tables were tremendous housing dozens of dealers from both sides of the Atlantic, Canada Post unveiled its new Travel Poster postage stamp series at the show's opening ceremonies. Canada Post also had a full philatelic centre with different custom cancels on each of the show's four days. Book Review "Let's Talk Exhibiting"

"New book educates, can inspire new and veteran exhibitors"

For nearly a decade David Piercey has authored a popular series of articles in the Canadian Philatelist entitled "Let's Talk Exhibiting." Now to promote exhibiting and CAPEX 22, Piercey has updated and organized all 46 articles into a new publication from the Royal Philatelic Society of Canada (RPSC) that will be of great interest to novice and experienced exhibitors and those thinking about entering the exciting sphere of philatelic exhibitions.

Let's Talk Exhibiting is organized into six logical parts: Getting Started in Exhibiting, Understanding the Basics, Understanding the Evaluation Criteria, Deepening Understanding, Exhibit Classes and Types, and Exhibiting Around Us. In a clear and readable style, Piercey covers just about everything a novice, intermediate or experienced exhibitor needs to get started or to improve their exhibit. The initial part of the book covers the essential basics of exhibiting including getting started, the anatomy of the exhibit page, title page and synopsis, and the exhibit plan. This is followed by detailed chapters allowing the exhibitor to tackle more complex issues such as following the story line, research, importance, presentation and technical issues including cover placement, double-sized pages and minimizing white space. Exhibits are awarded points for treatment, importance, philatelic knowledge and research, rarity and condition of the material on display and presentation. Points awarded are reflected in the medal level achieved by the exhibit: from bronze to large gold in eight levels. The score is provided to the exhibitor in the Exhibitor Feedback Form. Piercey, instrumental in developing the point system and the form, describes each category in detail along with suggestions to help the exhibitor maximize their score in each category.

Piercey describes all the exhibiting classes including popular ones such as traditional stamp exhibits, postal history, aerophilately, thematics and one-frame exhibits. Piercey also provides guidance on exhibiting cinderellas, topicals, modern subjects, preparing display exhibits and literature. Postcard exhibiting, which is growing in popularity, is thoroughly covered. Most chapters are accompanied by selected pages from award-winning Canadian exhibits that help to illustrate the messages conveyed in each chapter. Further, green highlighted boxes summarize the "take-home" lessons of the chapter and yellow highlighted boxes identify key points that help an exhibitor improve a competitive exhibit. For those who have never organized their collection into a regional or national exhibit, the book provides clear directions.

In total, these articles provide an outstanding handbook that will be useful to beginning, intermediate and advanced exhibitors. The book is accompanied by a bibliography of useful handbooks on exhibiting for those who want to read further.

The book is 174 pages and measures 8.5 by 11 inches. This allows sample exhibit pages to be reproduced with only a slight reduction so they are clear and readable. Even double-sized pages reproduce well. Robin Harris, editor of the Canadian Philatelist, has done the layout resulting in a high-quality publication. On some pages photos from the exhibition floor are used to fill white space. Unfortunately, some of the photos are a bit too dark and fuzzy, but overall the production is great.

The book begins with a forward by RPSC president Ed

Kroft, who explains the role of the society in Canadian philately and the impetus for the publication. Piercey has written a preface describing his role in leading the society's exhibit and judging committee for more than 12 years and the important role he played in developing the Exhibitor Feedback Form and its implementation in Canada and the U.S. This extensive experience led to the initiation of the Let's Talk Exhibiting series.

Thanks to the financial support of major Canadian auction houses, the V.G. Greene Foundation and the British North American Philatelic Society, the book is being made available at a reasonable cost, ensuring wide availability. To entice collectors to join Canada's national philatelic organization, the book contains information on obtaining a discounted digital member-

ship. In recent years, Piercey's articles have been published in the Canadian Philatelist in both English and French and it is hoped that a full translation of all of the articles will be available soon.

Seasoned exhibitor, judge and commissioner Joel Weiner is Commissioner General of CAPEX 22, and currently oversees the RPSC's judges accreditation program as its chair.



PIPEX George Struble Innovation Award

An Innovative Innovation Award

This year the PIPEX stamp show established a new award to recognize innovation in exhibiting, either innovation in exhibiting techniques and formats or new and unconventional exhibiting areas or topics. PIPEX named the award for George Struble; the PIPEX exhibits chair since 2014, who has done innovative things with his own exhibits and has also been a leader in developing virtual stamp shows. Thanks to George's leadership and the script developed by PIPEX's webmaster, Bill Seymour, PIPEX 2021 was the first, and to date only, World Series of Philately (WSP) virtual national show. George is also the driving force in PIPEX hosting a "hybrid" (in-person and virtual exhibits) show in 2023.

When George learned of the award being named after him, he felt greatly honored. But he continued, "If the award is to recognize innovation, the award itself should be innovative, not just a plaque, a certificate, a medal, or a ribbon." He gathered some miscellaneous bits of hardware and made a thingamabob, which he had mounted on a plaque; after all, something has to tell what it is! His friend Norma Nielson objected, "But your name isn't Bob; this is a thingamageorge!"

At the PIPEX awards ceremony on April 30, the first winner of the award was announced as Paul Schumacher for his exhibit "1874a, "a personal account of his connection with the color-omitted error sheet of the 1981 Everett Dirksen stamp and his role in having it listed in the Scott catalog as number 1874a." Mike Ley, the chief judge, explained how Schumacher's exhibit stood out as innovative by telling "the interesting story about the exhibitor's personal efforts to get an error listed and his subsequent study of other examples of the error as they came on the market." As Ley noted, "This not something we normally see." Schumacher's British Sudan collection and his numerous exhibits on various areas of Sudan philately have also been part of his major undertakings over the years.

You can view the whole exhibit at the PIPEX website pipexstampshow.org. Schumacher was not at the PIPEX show himself, so there is no photo of him receiving the award. But we have photos of George Struble and then Paul Schumacher, both holding the award.

The award is to be made annually. Fittingly, the award itself will be different every year. The 2023 award has already been crafted by Keith Janz, husband of Lisa Janz, a PIPEX committee member. Keith has a very capable workshop; Struble claims that the 2023 award is better than what he created.

Roger Brody, the PIPEX 2022 Grand Award winner, says he wants to return to PIPEX in 2023 to win the award himself!

Bend it Like Beck...erm!?! The Art of Modern Philately

The American Philatelic Society's Top Recruiter of 2020, Graham Beck (shown below), gave an eye opening, jaw dropping, window into the future of philately for those young and old, and those new and experienced. His presentation at CAPEX 2022 in Toronto took the audience on a ride of possibility in the world



of stamps. If his approach and enthusiasm won't kick start you into thinking about the hobby, I really don't think anything will. After his talk, I felt like I wanted to be 20 years old again and start a brand new journey on how I collect. But at 58, I'm ready!

Beck shared with us a whole host of fresh ways to engage in the hobby. For the past six years, Beck has released scores of motion picture shorts on his YouTube channel "Exploring Stamps". Before you finish reading this Journal, open your computer or favourite device and search "Exploring Stamps" on YouTube. I dare you to try just watching only one. You will be hooked!



Beck inspires the "philatelic tourist" in us through "Extreme Stamping" (image above). Basically it challenges you to take a stamp of your choice and find the exact spot on the planet where the actual featured image on the stamp is located, hold up your stamp with tongs, take a photo and "Voila!" You have just become a new age "Stamp Explorer!" - Ed.





Bill DeWitt, the "transportation guy," will be the first speaker on Thursday, August 25. His topic is The Evolution of Intercity Mail Routes and Mail Transportation 1840-1920: Horses To Aeroplanes. Bill will share some fun insights about the evolution of the United States Post Office Department and its intercity movement of mail in the years from 1840 to the era of World War I. The presentation will demonstrate the growth and changes in the intercity routes, mail route miles, as well as the amount of mail carried on those routes and mail miles traveled over those years. The modes, or types of transportation used by the department, changed radically from horses and coaches, to steamboats and then to railroads. This presentation will show data and detail from the 1840s to the advent of flying machines--aeroplanes, about the time of World War I.














Message from BNAPEX 2022 - Calgary






