Chocolatería San Ginés is one of the most beloved dessert spots in all of Spain, always buzzing with locals, families, and visitors from around the world. It's an unforgettable (and delicious) way to end your day in Madrid!

Return to the hotel for overnight

Construction began in 1882 and continues to this day, making it one of the longest-running construction projects in history. The year 2026 will be an especially meaningful time to visit, as Barcelona commemorates the 100th anniversary of Gaudí's passing. 2026 also marks the anticipated completion of the basilica's final major structural element—the Tower of Jesus Christ—bringing Gaudí's ambitious vision closer to full realization
