“Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect.” Romans 12:2 NRSV

Ministries never start big, even though with our future vision of any given ministry we feel called to start we tend to think, “This is going to be HUGE!” In my experience of starting and witnessing ministries begin, this is quite common. “Of course, people are going to absolutely LOVE this ministry and the world will be set on fire with renewed love of God and neighbor. We will change the entire world!” we might say. (Rather I have heard this said, at least in my own mind.) The truth is that ministries start off small and take time to form and solidify. If they make it that far and are picked up by enough committed people, they last long enough to enter a growth stage which then requires more time to re-form and solidify

Now churches go through similar stages. They can grow, but in growth there is change. And for the growth gained to remain, the church re-forms and solidifies, sometimes growing and sometimes shrinking until a sort of new life comes about, a new creation. Then

after some time, they can grow again, larger or smaller, re-form into something new and solidify. I have seen churches grow large, I have seen churches shrink, and I have seen churches hover in-between. None of those scenarios are “bad”, they just are. Each one, wherever it is now, started small. They started with a few people as a church “plant.” Like what Fr. Joel, our Curate for the last two years, is called to do in the Fort Worth area.

The verse from Philippians reminds us that Jesus did not come on a cloud with an army of angels as the Son of God, but instead came to us as a vulnerable human baby. Who, after growing up, gathered a relatively small group of faithful followers to share the Gospel in a small area that eventually expanded to the world. This was not overnight. In the beginning of Jesus’ ministry following his death and resurrection, the small ministry was oppressed and forced into having secret worship so as not to be detected.

The verse from Romans reminds us to be patient for what God’s will is for any given ministry. The world tells us that success means things must grow to astounding sizes. To go big or to go home. Do not fall into the trap that if the ministry is small, then it should stop or is a failure. Instead of conforming to this world of “bigger is better”, be transformed and renew your mind about smallness. That, if it is small and producing good fruit and is lasting, then it bears the sign of God’s will. Like Church Under a Bridge, or Just as I am,

or Conversations on Race, to name a few. Not that all ministries last forever, sometimes there are seasons: remember the Rum Cake ministry of St. Francis. Be renewed and refreshed that God can do so much more with the things we offer. Not everything will succeed, but whatever you do don’t let small numbers dissuade you from continuing a given ministry. It is the small things that can end up saving the world.


