Services:

Provides confidential services to women and men in their childbearing years (teens to premenopause). Services include gynecological ("GYN") exams, contraception (methods to prevent pregnancy), pregnancy testing and counseling, and nutrition education. Women can get pap tests, pelvic exams and breast exams. We provide STI (sexually transmitted infections) testing and treatment, and HIV testing for men and women and counseling. We also refer clients to other medical providers and community resources as needed.

We accept Medicaid, Medicare, and Medicaid Managed Care. We offer a sliding fee scale (based on ability to pay) for teens and patients without insurance. Ask about our free family planning benefits program.

Evaluation and Referrals for Children with Developmental Delays

Promotes awareness & provides guidance for children under 3 at risk for potential developmental delays.

Early Intervention Program (845) 364-2032

Provides evaluations for children under the age of 3 suspected of having a developmental delay. If eligible, services are provided to the child and their family.

Services

Provides confidential clinic for testing and treatment of sexually transmitted infections including on-site rapid HIV testing. Additional services include Expedited Partner Therapy (EPT); pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP); confidential HIV testing; vaccinations against Hepatitis A and Hepatitis B; and vaccination against Human Papillomavirus (HPV).

We treat all patients and provide relevant vaccinations at no direct cost to patients, regardless of insurance status.

Services

Provides immunizations for common childhood diseases for children/ adolescents enrolled in elementary through high school.

Adult Immunization Clinic

Services

Offers routine United States required adult immunizations for underserved and uninsured residents based on eligibility.

College students 19 and older are provided free MMR (measles/mumps/ rubella) vaccine with proof of enrollment.

Disease Prevention & Control (845) 364-2997

As mandated under the New York State Sanitary Code (10NYCRR 2.10, 2.14), this program receives reports of suspected or confirmed communicable diseases from physicians, nurses, laboratory directors, infection control practitioners, health care facilities, state institutions, and schools within 24 hours of diagnosis.

These communicable diseases may include Coronavirus (severe or novel), Hepatitis A, Measles, Rabies, Smallpox, and many others.

Epidemiology (845) 364-2997

Analyzes communicable and chronic disease data to identify trends and attempts to determine possible sources of illness to facilitate disease prevention. This is done in part through continuous monitoring of county hospital data for changes in disease patterns that may indicate emerging health problems in our communities, and through the development and implementation of the county's community health assessments and the community health improvement plans.

Provides analytical support for all Department of Health programs and responds to community requests for information about specific health concerns such as COVID-19, Measles, Hepatitis A, and others.

The Center for Rockland Codes Investigations (CRCI) fairly enforces the codes and ordinances of Rockland County to protect the health, property, and quality of life for all Rockland County residents.

Housing Complaints

The CRCI investigates all complaints affecting health and safety of County residents, including allegations involving single family dwellings, multiple dwellings, rental properties, and owner-occupied premises.

Housing Permits

Rooming houses, motels, hotels, and mobile home parks, as well as carnivals on Rockland County campgrounds, require a permit to operate. The CRCI inspects these properties annually and provides permits for these establishments.

Housing Code Enforcement

We perform inspections and enforcement actions to ensure that residential properties remain in compliance with the Rockland County Sanitary Code.

Multiple Dwelling Rental Registry Each home or building with 3 or more rental units must register and obtain a Multiple Dwelling Rental Certificate. Certificates are provided by the CRCI.

Home-Based Lead Assessments

The CRCI is alerted when children are found to have elevated levels of lead in their blood. Especially a problem for children, lead poisoning can cause slowed development, learning or behavior problems, lower IQ, hearing loss, and restlessness. Our inspectors work with homeowners and tenants to identify and eliminate lead exposure within the home.



Underage Tobacco Sales Our Adolescent Tobacco Use Prevention Act (ATUPA) program performs compliance checks at retail tobacco facilities in the County to ensure tobacco products are not sold to minors.

NYS Certified Tobacco Training

Free training is provided for tobacco retailers and their employees to support compliance with NYS tobacco laws.

Multiple Dwelling Smoking Law

The CRCI is responsible for enforcement of Local Law No. 6 of 2012 regulating smoking in multiple dwelling residences. The law requires that dwellings with 3 or more units establish and post a smoking policy. Dwellings with 5 or more units are additionally required to send a copy of this policy to the CRCI office.

Clean Indoor Air Act (CIAA)

We enforce provisions of the NYS CIAA by responding to all indoor tobacco smoke complaints

We investigate all smoking complaints in accordance with applicable local, state, and federal law.

Healthy Neighborhoods Program

The HNP offers home visits to identify and discuss a variety of environmental health and safety concerns in the home. Eligible Rockland County residents receive free products such as smoke & carbon monoxide detectors, asthma prevention products, and child safety locks. Body Art Permits

All body art establishments in Rockland County, including tattoo parlors and piercing salons, must apply and obtain an annual permit from the CRCI to operate. Permits are also required for Body Art practitioners employed at permitted establishments.

Body Art Inspections

The CRCI conducts annual inspections to ensure Body Art establishments are abiding by State and County health regulations.
