On September 11, Ukraine's Zaporozhye (zah-per-O-zhee) Nuclear Plant, the largest in Europe, shut down its sixth and final reactor. The plant had been under threat for months and is currently in Russian hands. As of the day of writing, the plant is currently connected to Ukrainian electricity & still has its backup diesel generator fuel, which could only last for ten days if isolated before a meltdown.

However, CNN experts say that "the risk of a Chernobyl-sized disaster is unlikely" but the threat is still foreboding. What this could mean for the rest of Europe; we don't know so far.

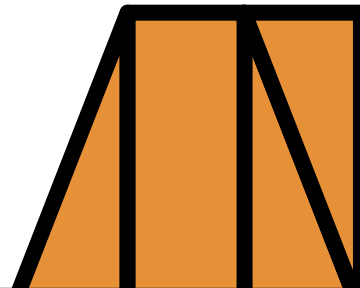

**Q: Why did you become a teacher?**

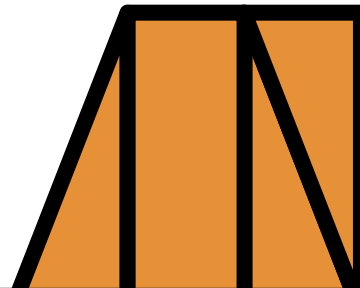
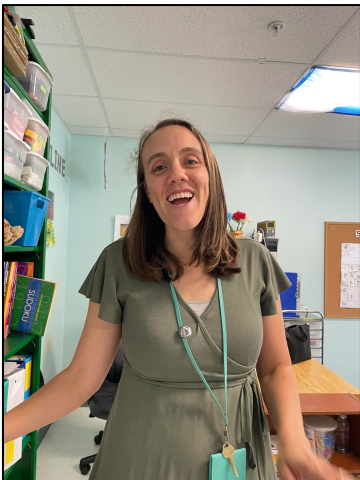

**Q: Why did you become a teacher?**

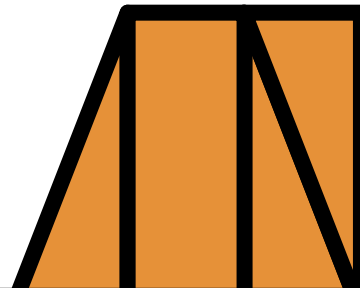

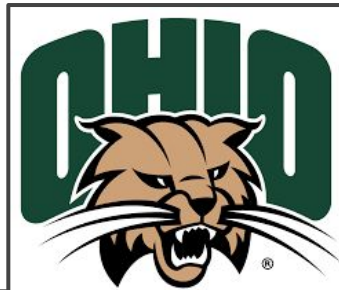

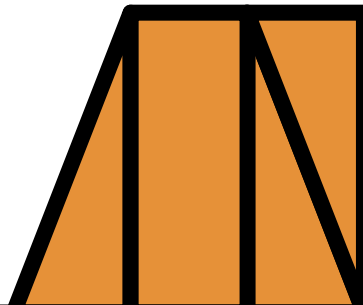
# Thor Love and Thunder by Ms. LeMoine

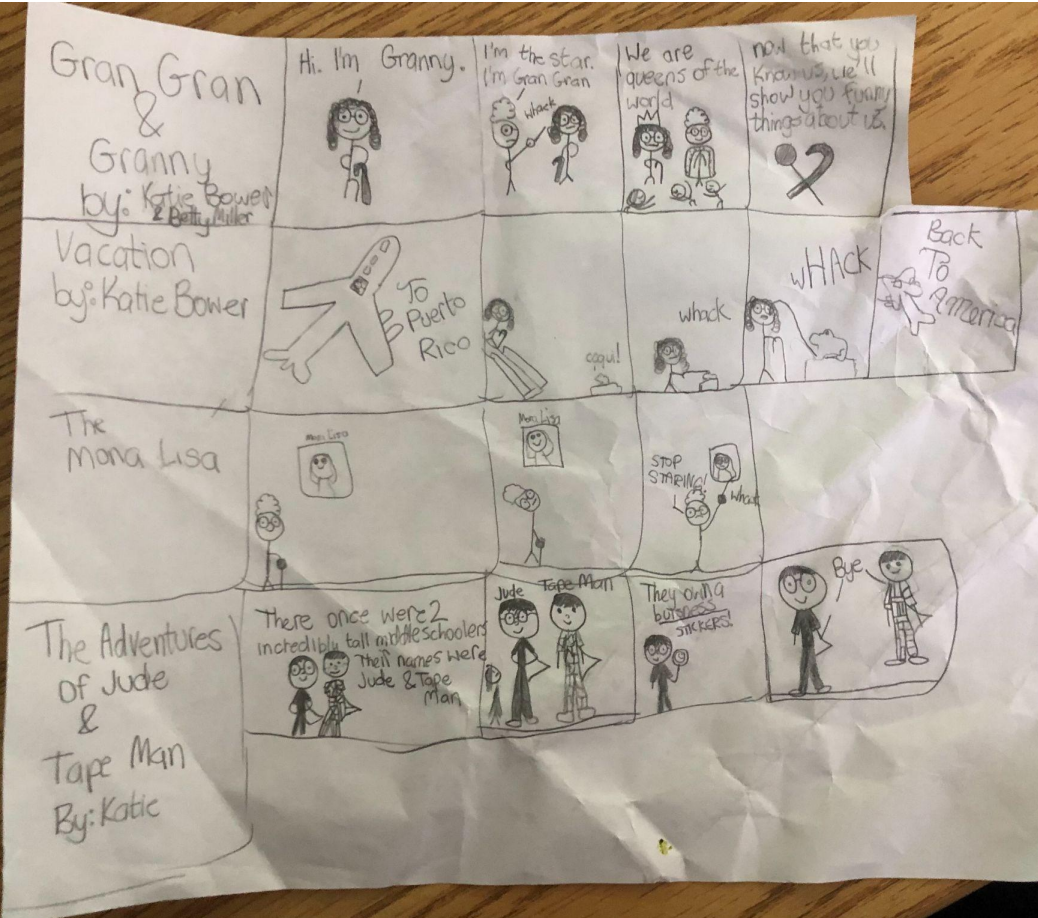


# 7th Grade Conflict
