Elbow is a small town with services and stores including gas. There is a boat launch at the south end of the camping area. Washrooms and change-rooms are available at the beach. As well as picnic sites, there is a fast food restaurant located at the beach. There are showers in the campgrounds. The Elbow harbor features a great golf course and a fine restaurant.
