There are three iconic Lighthouses on the central east coast of FL within approx. 60 miles from each other. The Ponce de Leon Lighthouse is the tallest in the state at 175 ft. tall. Located in and around a pristine park with museum and gift shop you won't want to miss this adventure if you're in the area. The other two lights are St. Augustine Lighthouse to the north and Cape Canaveral Lighthouse to the south. Our current subscribers know we fancy lighthouses as adventurers and enjoy not only the history but the importance they bring to the world of maritime navigation. After visiting the lighthouse at Ponce Inlet you can venture out to the inlet itself and walk the jetty where fishermen have made world class catches for nearly a century.
