We believe in building a strong, inclusive community by sharing our heritage with the wider community.


Our annual events, including Celebrando! Hispanic Heritage Month and Parrandón Navideño, are open to the public for all to enjoy the beauty of Latino culture.

CLASSES & WORKSHOPS

DANCE

This year we continued to offer year-round dance classes of different styles to all ages, in partnership with North Pointe Ballet, Abrepaso Flamenco, and the Cleveland Tango School.

Our quintessential **Latin Social Dance** class focuses on traditional Latin dances such as bomba, salsa, and merengue. Our traveling groups Grupo Coquí and Sabor Latino performed at various community events throughout the year.





VISUAL ART

Families and artists of all ages got in touch with their creativity in a variety of art workshops led by community members.

Workshops included crafts like **Ceramics** with Alberto Veronica Lopez, **Hanging Planters** with Yanilka Norma, and **Stamp Making** with Tahm Lytle, as well as cultural arts like **Sawdust Carpets** with Comité Mexicano de Cleveland, Puerto Rican **Veijgante Masks** with Becky Aviles, and Mexican **Nicho Boxes** with Marilyn Oliveras de Ortiz.

CLASSES & WORKSHOPS



HEALTHY HEARTS

JDBCAC prioritized mental and physical wellness through partnerships like **Youth Outdoors**, where students ages 8-11 go on monthly field trips to learn about the environment and get active with **the Cleveland Metroparks**.

We hosted the first ever **Love Yourself** community event, in collaboration with organizations like **Cleveland Clinic - Lutheran Hospital** and **Cleveland Play House**, where attendees used the arts to express self-love.



MUSIC

In partnership with the **Cleveland Classical Guitar Society,** our students participated in free guitar lessons throughout the year and performed a recital for friends and family.

We continued our summer tradition of hosting the **Amistad Caribbean Arts Camp**, culminating in a beautiful celebration of Afro-Caribbean music and culture in our performance space.



LITERATURE

Words were put to the page in poetry and prose through workshops like **Rhyme and Reason**, led by Gemini Jae and JP Hernandez, and **Spoken Word Poetry**, in collaboration with **Hasani Management and FranCeJone' Institute of Art.**

Our **JDBCAC Book Club** led by Nahomy Garcia met bimonthly to read and discuss books of different genres by Latino authors.

LATINA IMAGE LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

Our Latina Image Leadership Program builds leaders by inspiring and educating young Latina women to achieve their full potential through the power of sisterhood

UNIDOS POR EL ARTE

An artist initiative empowering Latino artists in Northeast Ohio

SUPPORT FOR ARTISTS GRANT

2023 marked the fourth cycle of our Support for Artists grant. With funding received from Cuyahoga Arts and Culture and Assembly for the Arts, we awarded 10 deserving artists \$5,000 each to complete a proposed project in their chosen discipline within their three-month residency. The projects culminated in individual showcases at our Celebrando! Hispanic Heritage Month event.





2023 GRANT RECIPIENTS

Alberto Ramos Cordero | Tango & Music

As a founder of the Cleveland Tango School, Alberto rebranded their tango salon, La Tertulia, fostering cultural exchange through dance, music, poetry, and visual arts.

Alberto Veronica Lopez | Ceramics

is a ceramicist and educator. He hosted a series of ceramics workshops at the Center, focused on creating mealtime vessels from Latino culture culminating in a community meal.

Becky Aviles | Vejigante Masks

is a Puerto Rican mask maker, facilitator, and performer of folkloric art. She completed an intensive training from a Puerto Rican mask maker, learning traditional techniques of mask making. Becky produced dozens of new masks, including an 11-foot Vejigante.

Luz Emma Cañas Madrigal | Installation of What The Fonk?

is a multi-disciplinary artist, storyteller and teaching artist. Through interview, research and musical experimentation, Luz's documentary project explored funk beyond the Americas to the African diaspora and the influence of African percussion instruments.

Jenna Martinez | Poetry & Printmaking

is a poet, illustrator and printmaker. With the grant, she created letterblock prints and zines, developed new works of poetry, and led a shape poetry Ofrenda workshop.

Miguel Hernandez | Comic Book

is a storyteller, artist, writer and educator. Miguel completed a self published comic book *The Adventures of Hanzo: Wrath of Winter*, inspired by martial arts and Japanese arts and culture.

Ricardo Morales Vivero | Original Music

is a guitarist and composer. Ricardo completed his first full album of original music. The album, Introspectiva, showcases influences of Latin American rock and mirrors his development as an artist.

Sāber | Punk Rock Band

is a musician, playwright, and cartoonist zine maker. With the grant, they organized the new punk band Barricade Baby, building a space for rehearsals and purchasing equipment and instruments to produce new music and support live performance.

Tahmyrah Lytle | Zines - prints - button making

is an activist, musician, and multimedia artist. They received one-on-one training from block printing artist Nikita Yogaraj, became a member of Zygote press and secured supplies to lead multiple community workshops about linocut printmaking.

Virginia Paguaga | Photography & Culture

is a Nicaraguan reporter, photographer, video editor and audiovisual producer. For her project, "Centroamerica Existe", Virginia interviewed and photographed Central Americans in the Greater Cleveland area to discuss their experiences.



INSTITUTIONAL & ARTIST RESIDENCY AT MOCA

This year, Unidos por el Arte artist initiative reached a new level with the opportunity of an institutional and artist residency at Museum of Contemporary Art (moCa) Cleveland. We made a home away from home in the dedicated studio space on the third floor of the museum, serving as an extension of our campus. The space was used as a gallery and for cultural art workshops. Our artist were the first to be featured in the first floor Residency Gallery, opening with a solo exhibition by **Bruno Casiano.**

With the success of our exhibitions, our residency was extended by six months into 2024, officially closing with another solo exhibition by **Ariel Vergez.**





2023 MoCa x JDBCAC Residency Cohort

This residency was an exciting opportunity for our artists. Through this partnership, we selected a cohort of six early-career Latino artists that would receive stipends, mentorship, professional development and exposure to new audiences. Their final projects would be the first group exhibit to be featured in the new Residency Gallery at moCa.

FERIA DE CLEVELAND

Our annual celebration inspired by Spain's traditional spring festival, in partnership with Abrepaso Flamenco.

PLEIBOL

Pleibol 2023 was a home run! In partnership with the Baseball Heritage Museum, sponsored by the Cleveland Guardians, this fundraiser is an action-packed weekend honoring Black and Latino contributions to baseball. This year, the field lights were turned on for the first time in League Park's history, with Mayor Bibb giving the signal. Attendees ran the bases and enjoyed baseball tournaments, games, and food.

CELEBRANDO

Our signature Hispanic Heritage Month event honors the rich cultural heritage of Cleveland's Hispanic/Latino communities. Our campus was full of life with kids in painting workshops, dancing indoors and outdoors, artist exhibitions of all disciplines, a delicious meal from Cilantro Taqueria, and a punk rock afterparty with Barricade Baby to end the night!
